HOBOS FOUND CUTTING  
OPEN A SUIT CASE  
ARRESTED SHORT TIME AFTERWARD AND GIVEN JAIL SENTENCE—OTHER TWO TURNED OVER TO JUVENILE COURT

Five hobos were arrested by Chief of Police Farrington and Constable Plank at the hobo camp near the woolen mill this morning for cutting open a suit case belonging to two transients at Springfield Junction and taking therefrom a suit of clothes, several neckties, a book and other articles.

The suit case belonged to T. E. Sidwell, who, with Truman Draper, was traveling through the country looking for work, they said. They had camped at Springfield Junction and were away from camp a few minutes this morning when these five hobos appeared and cut open the suit case and rifled its contents. Ray Emerson, a young man residing in this city, was coming back from Springfield at the time and he saw the hobos cutting open the grip. Draper in vain appeared and discovering his loss, set out to look for the miscreants. Emerson told what he saw and they followed the hobos to Eugene, seeing them go to the hobo camp. The officers were notified and a raid was made on the camp, where perhaps fifteen men were eating their breakfast. The goods were found on the five pointed out by Emerson and they were at once taken to Justice of the Peace Bryson's court. They gave their names as follows: James White, John Carlson, Charles Johnson, Roy McPherson and Carl Lacey. The last two named being only 17 years old, they were turned over to the juvenile court. The other three pleaded guilty and were sentenced to 10 days each in the county jail. They seemed them.

Young Lacey said he was already a member of the juvenile court of Portland, and was out on parole. They both had been at San Francisco and were hobbing their way back to Portland.  
Juvenile Officer Williams communicated with the boys' parents in Portland. It was learned that they were not bad boys and it is probable that they will be sent home.
