PRESIDENT SENDS SPECIAL MESSAGE

subject to the prohibition contained in the anti-trust law into which it was desired to enter might be filed with the bureau of corporations or other appropriate executive body. This should be done publicly, say within sixty days of the filing—each period could be extended by order of the department whenever for any reason it did not give the department sufficient time for a thorough examination it did not give the department having power might forbid the contract, which would then become subject to the provisions of the anti-trust law. If no prohibition was issued the contract would then be only liable to attack on the ground that it constituted an unreasonable restraint of trade. Whenever the period of filing has passed without any such prohibition, the contracting combination could be disapproved or forbidden only after notice and hearing with a reasonable provision for summary review on appeal to the courts. Labor organizations, farmer organizations and other organizations not organized for the purpose of profit, would be allowed to register under the law, by a law, by giving the location of the head office, charter and by-laws and the names and the addresses of their principal officers. In the interest of all the organizations, business, labor and farmers alike—the present provision permitting recovery of three fold damages should be abolished and as a substitute therefore the right of recovery allowed for should only be the damages sustained by the plaintiff and the cost of suit, including a reasonable attorney's fee.

The law should affect pending suits. A short statute of limitations should be provided so far as the past is concerned, not to exceed a year. Moreover, and even more in the interest of labor than of business combinations, all such suits brought for causes of action heretofore occurred should be brought only if the contract or the combination complained of was unfair or unreasonable. It may be well to remember that all the suits hitherto brought by the government under the anti-trust law have been in cases where the combination or contract was in fact unfair, unreasonable and against the public interest.

Trade Agreements. It is important that we should encourage trade agreements between employer and employe when they are just and fair. A strike is a clumsy weapon for righting wrongs done to labor and we should extend so far as possible the process of conciliation and arbitration as a substitute for strikes. Moreover, violence and disorder and coercion, when committed in connection with strikes, should be as promptly and sternly repressed as when committed in any other connection, but strikes themselves are not to be recognized to be entirely illegal. Combinations of working men have a peculiar reason for their existence. The very wealthy individual employe, and still more, the very wealthy corporations, stand at an enormous advantage when compared with the individual workingman; and while there may be many cases where it is not necessary for laborers to form a union, in many cases it is indispensable, for otherwise the thousands of small units, the thousands of individual workingmen, will be left helpless in their dealings with the one big unit, the big individual or corporation employe.

For Free Wood Pulp. "I am of the opinion, however,

that one change in the tariff could with advantage be made forthwith. Our forests need every protection, and one method of protecting them would be to put on the free list pulp wood, with a corresponding reduction upon paper made from wood pulp when they come from any country that does not put an export duty on them.

"Ample provision should be made for a permanent waterways commission with whatever power it is required to make it effective. The expectations of the people will not be realized unless congress provides at this session for the beginning and prosecution of the actual work of waterway improvement and control. The congress should realize in the fullest fashion the fact that the subject of the conservation of our natural resources with which this commission deals is literally vital for the future of this nation.

"Numerous bills granting water power rights on navigable streams have been introduced. None of them gives the government the right to make a reasonable charge for the valuable privilege granted, despite the fact that these water powers are

equivalent to many thousands of acres of the best coal lands for their production of power. Nor is any definite time limit set as should always be done in such cases. I shall be obliged hereafter, in accordance with the policy stated in a recent message, to veto the right of the president or of the secretary concerned to fix and collect such a charge as he may find to be just and reasonable in such case."

The damage was \$2000. Ill feeling over the employment of men to build the bridge is believed to be the cause of the outrage.
