OREGON ELECTRIC WILL PUSH LINE TO THIS CITY

(Albany Democrat.) Guy Talbot, the able manager of the Oregon Electric Company, a young man who does things, Mr. Miller, chief engineer in the field of the work of the company, and Mr. Turner, the contractor who is building the Forest Grove line, were in the city last evening and met informally with Albany business men at the Alco Club in a social session.

The company is directing its operations toward the completion of the Forest Grove line. As soon as that is completed active work will begin on the line from Salem to Albany. Already preliminary work is being attended to, a gang of surveyors being in the field, and rights of way will be secured. It is proposed to push the line to Eugene. The company does not expect to build an Albany system, simply pass through the city. It is entirely independent of the Welch line.

Mr. Talbot reports the financial outlook improving and the prospects are good for money for enterprises of this character.
