GREAT MUSICAL EVENT IN EUGENE APRIL 14 AND 15

GREATEST MUSICAL MOVEMENT EVER ORGANIZED IN THIS PART OF THE STATE NOW UNDER WAY IN EUGENE—TRAINING BEGAN THE FIRST OF JANUARY.

Without any possible exception, the greatest musical movement ever organized in this part of the state, is now under way in Eugene. The choral society of Eugene—known as the Eugene Oratorio Society—reorganized its chorus with 175 members this winter and began training in January for a big musical festival in April. The choral works chosen were Gaul's "Holy City" and Dudley Buck's "Golden Legend," each of which will require between an hour and a half and two hours to sing.

Ten or twelve years ago, when the chorus here was small in number, perhaps not numbering more than forty or fifty singers, the accompaniments to the singing were furnished by a single piano. As the chorus grew in numbers, however, the volume of tone from a piano was not large enough to sustain the chorus and other instruments were brought into requisition to very great advantage. But these instruments never made an entirely satisfactory orchestra. The players were mostly amateurs, and could not be expected to have great proficiency.

Five years ago, however, a decided step in advance was made, when at the spring musical festival of 1903, the management introduced the Portland Symphony Orchestra to accompany the chorus which numbered over 150 and was drawn from Eugene, Salem, Albany, Corvallis and Portland.

This year the chorus of 175 voices will have its accompaniments played by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra of sixty-four pieces. There are twenty violins in the first section

alone, in this great organization. Think of the volume from twenty violins in the hands of professional musicians, and all playing the same part—playing in unison. This with ten violins in the second violin section, six violas, six violincellos, and four bass violas make a total of forty-six stringed instruments, besides the harp. In the other sections there is the full number of clarinets, oboes, flutes and bassoons, which, with a quartette of French horns and a full number of trumpets, trombones and percussion instruments—kettles and other drums—round out one of the greatest orchestras this country can boast.

It costs \$1250 a day to run this orchestra every day it is out on the road. They carry two Pullman coaches, a diner and a baggage car for their private use. They have their own chef, cook and waiters, and often form a special train in making connections with their engagements. With the orchestra is a quartet of vocal soloists of national reputation.

It necessitated assuming a very great expense and risk by the choral society to secure this attraction which appears at only one other point in Oregon—Portland. But by offering such a great musical combination as this, a general interest in the event has been aroused and many outside of Eugene will be induced to attend.

The chorus is working regularly under the direction of Professor Glen and will be the best balanced and altogether strongest body of singers heard in any of the valley festivals.

Tickets for the season of three concerts—April 14th, 15th, with a matinee on the afternoon of the 15th, and a different programme at each concert—will be sold at \$3.00. The details may be seen in the large advertisements in this paper.
