Salem, Or., March 28.—Yesterday was the last day for filing petitions for placing names on the primary ticket for state, congressional and district offices. Secretary of State Benson kept his office open until midnight last night for the purpose of receiving petitions, and a number came in on late trains. The candidates for the various state and congressional offices are as follows:

The Democrats expect to nominate their candidates for other offices by writing their names in the primary ballot instead of having them printed on the ballot by petition.
In the third judicial district John H. McNary has no opposition for re-nomination, and thus far no Democratic candidate has appeared.

There is some doubt as to the validity of the petition of R. Robertson, candidate for railroad commissioner in this district, the question being whether he has secured signatures from one-tenth of the precincts in Lane county. The question will be determined today when it will be learned how many precincts there are in that county.

RAILS ORDERED FOR WELCH SYSTEM

Salem, March 29.—A carload of rails have been ordered and will arrive in Salem next week for the new electric railway system of the Welch people. The ties are already here and are distributed along the right of way, and as soon as the rails arrive the work of laying them will be prosecuted vigorously. The work will commence at the corner of Ferry and High streets.

This is the good news brought by F. M. Waters, who returned last evening from Portland, where he had gone to consult with Mr. Welch and to make arrangements for the immediate starting of work on the local lines. Another car of rails will reach Albany at the same time and the work of laying the rails there will be done simultaneously with the work here.

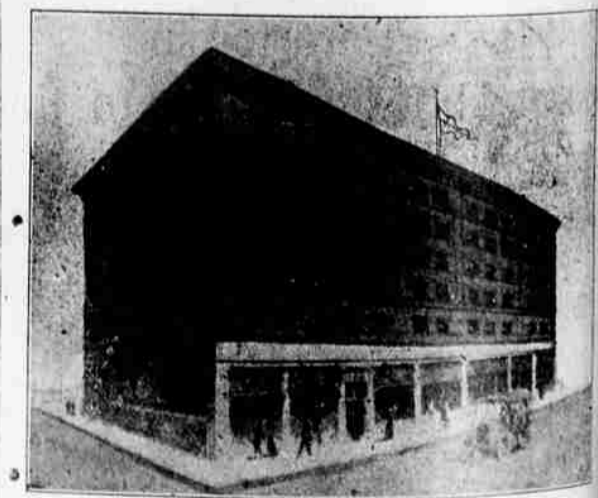
