VESSEL LEAKING BADLY AND EFFORTS TO GET HER AFOAT ABANDONED

The gasoline schooner Berwick, which went ashore at the mouth of the Siuslaw about two weeks ago, is leaking badly and efforts to get her afloat have been abandoned. The crew were discharged last Sunday for Portland next day. Captain Olson, who came here, could be done about getting the vessel off, is now awaiting orders from headquarters. He informed us yesterday that he thinks every effort and rigging will be taken off and the hull abandoned.

The vessel was built some twenty years ago, so the hull is not very valuable.
