## GRAND JURY CENSURES ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON

New York, March 29.—The grand jury filed today with Judge Foster, in the Court of General Sessions, the following report: "Testimony has been given before the grand jury attending the hearing of the Attorney-General of the state, and an offer has been extended to the attorney-general to appear before the grand jury to give testimony in regard thereto. The Attorney-General has appeared and testified and there appears to be a conflict in respect to matters brought before us. The office of Attorney-General is one of such transcendent importance in the administration of the business of the state and the confidence of the people of the state in the integrity of the Attorney-General is so essential to the public welfare that we call for attention of your honor to it, and we

quest the clerk of the court to transmit this presentment and a copy of the testimony of the proceedings to the Governor of New York, the President of the Senate of the state and the Speaker of the Assembly of New York for action."

After receiving the document, Judge Foster said he had received communication from the Attorney-General that in the event of a paper being filed in regard to him, he wanted an opportunity to ask that it be expunged from the record before being made public as "entirely illegal and scandalous." After instructing the secretary of the grand jury to read the paper, Judge Foster said he would place it on file and determine later what course he would take with regard to it.

Attorney-General Jackson said tonight that he would move immediately to have the grand jury report stricken from the court record. He said:

"I consider that the grand jury, in making any such report violates the statute in reference to the secrecy of grand jury proceedings. A court should not allow a grand jury to make such a report. There is no authority in any court to send such material to the legislature."

### ASKS INCREASE FOR EUGENE POSTOFFICE BUILDING

Washington, March 22.—Congressman Ellis requested the committee on public buildings in framing the omnibus bill to make appropriations of \$75,000 each for buildings at Portland and Lathrop. Congressman Hawley asked to increase the appropriation \$50,000 at Eugene also \$10,000 at Albany and \$125,000 at Roseburg.
