## GERMANS FAVOR THE UNIVERSITY APPROPRIATION

GERMAN RELIEF SOCIETY OF EUGENE ADOPTS RESOLUTIONS AT MEETING HELD ON APRIL 5—THEY BELIEVE IN HIGHER EDUCATION AND USEFULNESS OF UNIVERSITY

The German Relief Society of Eugene and Lane county, adopted the following resolutions unanimously at a regular meeting held by the society at Eugene on April 5th:

Whereas, The last Oregon Legislature appropriated the sum of \$125,000 to be expended for the support and maintenance of the University of Oregon; and

Whereas, Said appropriation has been referred to a vote of the people and will be voted upon by the people of this state at the coming election in June; and

Whereas, We, German born citizens, believing in higher education and knowing fully the value of a thorough and efficient educational system, and believing that the University of Oregon will in the future, as it has been in the past, be a credit and source of pride to the whole state of Oregon; and

Whereas, The University of Oregon has taught many hundreds of students (fully two hundred alone in 1907 and 1908) the German language and German literature; and whereas, we consider the University of Oregon as one of the centers of German culture; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That we hereby pledge our support to secure a liberal appropriation for the maintenance and support of the University of Oregon, and that we urge all German born and German speaking citizens of Lane county and of the whole state of Oregon to vote for the full amount of the University appropriation at the coming general election next June.

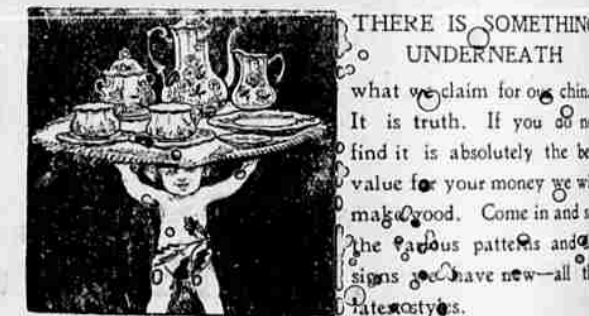
