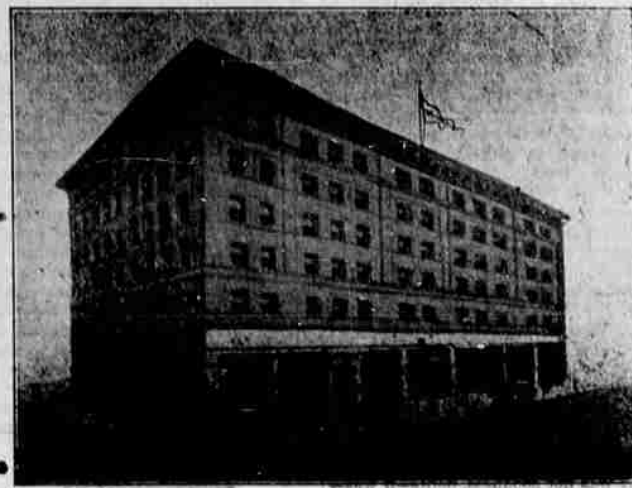

## Y. W. C. A. MEETING CAME TO CLOSE LAST EVENING

The Y. W. C. A. convention held its final and closing meeting last night in Villard hall, when Dr. Van Waters preached the convention sermon to about six hundred people. Resolutions were read thanking the people of Eugene and the press for their kind aid. The University, its students, President Campbell, and the two local Y. W. C. A.'s were also commended for their efforts and entertainment.

Some mention was also made of the work in the hop fields by Miss Gage, the executive secretary for the Northwest.

One tenth of the people of Oregon are in the hop fields in September. While the yards of the small growers are usually perfectly safe for women pickers, the larger yards frequently prove pitfalls for the unprotected. During the coming season, with the help of the hopgrowers, the Y. W. C. A. will attempt to put association workers in all the larger yards to catch the evils. Last autumn they opened their campaign along this line. Organization of this kind will probably also be established in the berry fields as soon as funds and finances permit.
