Albany (Special, April 6). Today is the golden wedding anniversary of Rev. and Mrs. P. A. Moses, of Corvallis, formerly of this city, and tonight from 7 to 10 p. m. at the residence of Rev. C. L. McCausland the event will be celebrated in the proper manner, one morning of remembrance. Rev. Moses resided at Tangent for many years, was principal of the Albany public schools for a while, and county superintendent, as well as pastor of the M. E. church south of this city. Of sterling Southern blood the worthy couple have played their part well in life. They have five children, now residing at Corvallis, Eugene, Philomath and Parker, Arizona, and one daughter, Mrs. Jenks, of Tangent.

SPECIAL CITY ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the city of Eugene, Saturday, April 18th, 1908. At which the following propositions will be submitted to the legal voters of the city for approval or rejection: 1. An initiative bill filed in the office of the city recorder January 4, 1908, providing for the amendment of sections 108 and 112 of the city charter. The ballot title of this measure states the purpose of the act to be to strike out authority to issue \$100,000 of electric light bonds and \$75,000 of gas light bonds, and to increase the issuable water bonds from \$100,000 to \$300,000. It character and manner of issuing such bonds and the distribution of water revenue, authorize condemnation proceedings in building water plant, provide for a water board and fix its duties. 2. An initiative bill filed in the office of the city recorder January 4, 1908, to amend the city charter by adding a new section, 135, providing for the prohibition of burials within the city limits. 3. Proposition to purchase for the sum of \$140,000 the water plant and property of the Willamette Valley Company according to the offer of said company filed in the office of the city recorder March 21st, 1908. Polling place, located at corner of Poling place, Book and Laidler room in the city hall building, No. 29 East Eighth street. THIRD WARD-Sherman Heller, R. S. Bryson and William G. Martin; Bryson and Martin designated as clerks. Polling place, Heller's shop, 11 West Seventh street. FOURTH WARD-D. E. Yorau, G. F. Hurd and S. P. Noss; Hurd and Noss designated as clerks. Polling place, Wilkins building, 68 West Eleventh street. Polls to be opened at 8 o'clock a. m. and closed at 7 p. m. on said 18th day of April, 1908. D. P. DARRER, Recorder.

FIRST NATIONAL BANK GETS TEUTSCH STOCK

Pendleton, Or., April 6.-At public auction this morning the bankrupt mercantile stock of Leo Teutsch was sold to G. M. Rice, cashier of the First National Bank, at 55 cents on the dollar. Rice was the highest bidder. The stock involved at \$39,000, and the indebtedness amounts to \$4700. The First National Bank holds the largest claim.

Thirty-six cents on the dollar was the opening bid. This was soon raised, a number of Eastern Oregon merchants bidding. The sale will probably be reopened under the direction of Rice, acting for the bank, in the near future.

GOVERNOR INVITED TO VISIT PRESIDENT

Salem, Or., April 6.-Governor Chamberlain this morning received an invitation from President Roosevelt to attend a dinner at the White House on Tuesday evening, May 12, when there will be an assemblage of governors and other officials to discuss the question of national resources. Governor Chamberlain hopes to be able to attend but is afraid that he will be unable to do so, owing to pressing matters.

Salem, Or., April 6.-The remains of the late J. C. Goddale, who died at Sawtelle, Cal., were accorded a Masonic funeral, Saturday afternoon, at the First Presbyterian church. Rev. Babcock conducted the services. A special car of the Masonic brotherhood came down from Eugene and Grand Tyler S. M. Yorau of that city read the ritual at the grave. Mr. Goddale was a man who was held in high regard among his friends in Western Oregon.
