### HECKART GIVEN CONTRACT FOR HIGH SCHOOL ADDITION

The school board held a meeting at Chas. Reiser's office last night at 7:30 o'clock at which time the contract for the erection of the addition to the high school building was let to W. O. Heckart, whose bid was \$35,000. There were other bids as follows: Green, \$37,000; Shuman, \$38,000; and \$200.  
The school will begin work on the addition at once and the new west wall of the building will be torn out and work on the superstructure commenced. It will be completed by the time the classes are resumed in September.  
The addition will give five more rooms for the high school and increase the seating capacity of the assembly room from 400 to 500.

### NO MORE CUSPIDORS IN RAILWAY DEPOTS

Sale, Or., April 8.—For the reason that the average tobacco chewer usually misses the cuspidor, and it is impossible to keep the floor in good condition where cuspidors are used, the use of these receptacles has been discontinued at Grants Pass and other points along the line of the Southern Pacific in Josephine county, according to the report of General Manager J. P. O'Brien, to the railroad commission, upon the sanitary condition of stations on the line of the Southern Pacific and O. R. & N., received today. This report comes in response to complaints filed with the commission by patrons of stations and county boards of health as to the unsanitary condition of stations in Benton, Clackamas, Josephine, Lane, Polk, Yamhill, Marrow, Sherman, Union and Wasco counties, in which Mr. O'Brien assures the commission that the railroad companies are doing all in their power to remedy the conditions complained of and the objectionable features in the majority of cases have already been removed and corrected.

### EXPOSURE OF MINING COMPANIES BY OREGONIAN

The representatives of the Comstock Golden Gate Mining Company of Virginia City, Nevada, are jubilant over the Morning Oregonian's exposure of certain mining companies on the Comstock lode, which were recently sued in the United States courts in Nevada for stealing ore to the extent of \$1,000,000 from the Golden Gate Company's mine, the latter company being plaintiff in the action. This company owns the richest ground in the camp, and while they were sinking their shaft below the 600-foot level the neighboring mines ran in on the 2000-foot level from a deep shaft adjoining and stole several millions in ore.

The suit which the Golden Gate Company then filed has been the means of exposing a systematic policy of graft which has robbed the public for nearly thirty years, their money going into salaries for officials instead of development work in the mines.

The Golden Gate Company predicts bonanza days again for this great camp, which has produced over \$600,000,000 in dividends.

### RAILS FOR ALBANY'S ELECTRIC STREET CAR LINE ARRIVE

G. M. Knox this morning, assisted by several employees of the Willamette Valley Company, began hauling rails, 56-pounders, for the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railroad, of which A. Welch is the promoter, says the Albany Democrat. The first carload will be emptied along six blocks of Second street. Three more carloads are said to be on the way. Active work has to be begun by the 11th. Will Mr. Hirschberg begin an injunction suit? Perhaps not, because Mr. Hirschberg has to secure his power from Welch's company for a trolley system, for which two electric cars have been ordered, and how dare he, and why should he? The situation is interesting.

### OREGON PIONEERS PLAN ANNUAL REUNION IN JUNE

The board of directors of the Oregon Pioneer Association at a recent meeting considered arrangements for the 36th annual reunion of the organization, which will be held in Portland Thursday, June 11. A number of new features for the purpose of making the reunion more successful were discussed, and Robert A. Miller was appointed a committee of one to present the program along this line. Those present were: President Joseph D. Lee (1848), Portland; Vice President J. E. Moore (1852), Portland; Secretary George H. Himes (1843), Portland; Corresponding Secretary Robert A. Miller (1854), Portland; P. H. D'Arcy (1858), Salem; Cyrus H. Walker (1878), Albany.  
C. G. George (1851), Portland was chosen speaker of the day. Rev. A. J. Hunsaker (1847), Astoria, will act as chaplain, and Joseph Buchtel (1852), Portland, as marshal, with power to choose his own aids.

Committees were appointed as follows: Finance, Joseph D. Lee, Geo. H. Himes and J. E. Magers; transportation, George H. Himes; chairman of reception committee, Robert A. Miller, with power to choose his own aids; general committee of arrangements, Joseph D. Lee, George H. Himes and Robert A. Miller.

### DEMOCRATS TO NOMINATE CHAMBERLAIN AT THE POLLS

The Democrats of Oregon, by their own volition, are expected to write the name of George E. Chamberlain in on the primary ballots on April 17 and thus nominate him as the party's choice for United States senator. In announcing his candidacy for the senate, Governor Chamberlain took the ground that he would make the race, provided the members of the party by their vote at the primary election called him to the task. He outlined his position regarding the senatorship, and then left the matter of nomination in the hands of the voters. It is expected, therefore, that he will be given the full party vote of nomination, this being accomplished by writing his name in the blank space left on the nominating ballot.
