**ESTIMATE OF ENGINEERS ON WATER PLANT**

ENGINEERS GIVE FIGURES ON PLANT BASED ON COST VALUE. FACTS FOR CONSIDERATION OF VOTERS AT SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD APRIL 18

The following is an estimate of the total replacement cost of the present water works system of Eugene, Oregon, as made and agreed upon by J. R. Thompson, a civil engineer of Portland, acting on the part of the Willamette Valley Company, and the city engineer on the part of the city, and presented to the city council in November, 1907, each and every article listed and given its first cost value, with the cost of installation added. An itemized inventory and map of the system will be found at the office of the city engineer.

**Estimate of Depreciation.**  
The following estimate of the depreciation of the system was given to the fire and water committee of the city council by the city engineer about November 30, 1907:

Of the present system 1 and 7000 feet of 2 1/2 inch pipe, 15,000 feet of 3-inch pipe and 2,000 feet of 3-inch pipe that has been in use from 12 to 20 years. The present cost of replacing this pipe would be \$10,331, estimating the deterioration of pipe at 40 per cent it would be less valuable in the sum of \$4156.49.

The 6-inch pipe from the old reservoir to the old pumping station on the north side of Skinner's Butte has been laid for more than 20 years, and is at present supplying water to one family. The present value is 40 per cent of the cost of new pipe. Cost of new pipe, \$747.90, present value 30 per cent of replacement cost, \$224.37. Of the 1200 feet of cast iron pipe, 688 inches, it has been laid 20 years, and in that time has deteriorated in value at least 20 per cent, which amounts to a deduction of \$1,695.82. The cost of the old or low service reservoir was \$2577.25. The walls need to be rebuilt and made of heavier construction, and this defect would reduce the present value of the reservoir \$1000.

The 12-inch pipe on Alder street was laid in a trench that had been left open for several weeks during the rainy season and the bottom of the trench covered with muck to a depth of several inches. The trench will need to be opened and the pipe joints tightened, and a firm foundation made for the pipe. The cost of repairing pipe on Alder street is estimated at \$300.

The pipe across the river from the pumping station will perhaps be carried away by the next freshet and the cost of fixing it lost.

The Worthington pump and the Gould power pump have been in use several years and are worth probably 60 per cent of their replacement cost. A deduction of 40 per cent amounts to \$1525.

The remainder of the plant has been in use from one to three years, and has only a nominal per cent of deterioration of 3 to 10 per cent.

Taking the deterioration at 10 per cent this would leave a total net value of the plant of \$92,741.03.
