There he will place himself in Mike Murphy's hands and train daily under the University of Pennsylvania mentor's direction at Franklin Field.

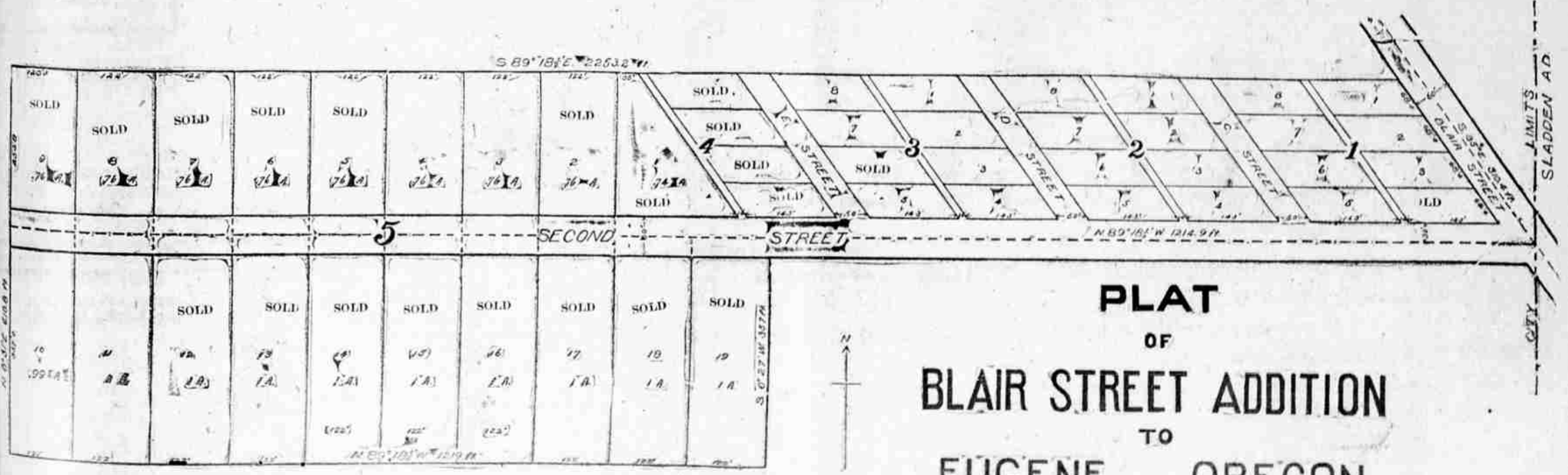
