BEAN, CALKINS AND EATON FOR REPRESENTATIVES

DREW GRIFFIN RECEIVES NOMINATION FOR SHERIFF AND KEENEY FOR ASSESSOR

LEE WINS HANDILY OVER CALLISON FOR CLERK AND DILLARD FOR COUNTY SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT AGAIN—SHARP CONTEST BETWEEN EATON AND EDWARDS

According to the returns received at the Grand office up to this afternoon, Louis E. Bean, Winsor W. Calkins and Allen H. Eaton are the nominees for representative on the Republican ticket, Drew Griffin is the nominee for sheriff, E. U. Lee for clerk, B. F. Keene for assessor, Walter B. Dillard for school superintendent, Robert E. Eastland for county treasurer, G. R. Chrisman for county judge, C. M. Collier for surveyor, Hugh M. Price for commissioner and W. T. Gordon for coroner. The last four candidates were without opposition and received the entire vote of the party.

Probably the closest fight was between Allen H. Eaton and I. N. Edwards for representative. Last night when the returns began to come in they were about even for a long time, but finally Eaton began to forge ahead, and this afternoon he leads Edwards by a good majority, with twelve or thirteen small precincts to hear from yet.

After Edwards comes A. C. Jennings, and C. J. Dodd received the smallest vote. For county clerk there was no doubt as to the outcome from the first, as nearly every precinct gave E. U. Lee a majority over O. F. Callison. An occasional precinct, however, gave Callison a majority, among them being North Junction, Lee's home precinct, which, Mr. Lee says, always goes against him.

Drew Griffin is easily in for sheriff by several hundred votes, although I. T. Nicklin ran well in a number of precincts and for a time at the beginning of the count it looked as if the vote would be much closer than it is.

B. F. Keene wins easily over D. P. Burton, for assessor, and P. D. Newell comes third.

Walter B. Dillard, for school superintendent, won handily over H. G. Baughman, his majority being well up in the hundreds.

F. T. Plank is the nominee for constable for the Eugene district, winning over Geo. Fisher by over 100 votes. R. S. Bryson is the nominee for justice of the peace, he being the only candidate in the field.

The Democrats, as nominated at the polls, is as follows:

For representatives—Leon R. Edmunson, Joseph D. Matlock and Allen Eaton, the last named being one of the Republican nominees, the Democrats endorsing him because of his Statement No. 1 declaration.

County Clerk—Henry W. Stewart. Sheriff—Harry L. Bown. County Judge—John W. Baker. County treasurer—James M. Kitchen.

County school superintendent—Elli R. Parker. Surveyor—Simon Kloydahl. County Commissioner—Guard Hus-ton.

Coroner—Waldo L. Cheshire. George Croner was nominated for constable in the Eugene district over John J. Hess.
