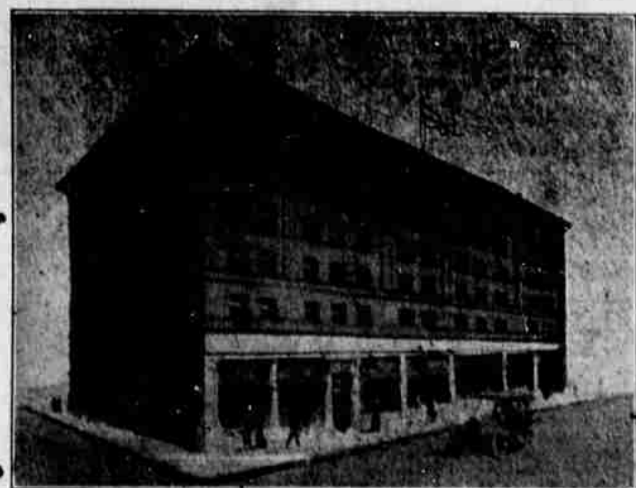

# EARLY ELECTION NEWS IS FULLY CONFIRMED

Portland, April 18.—Yesterday's primaries resulted in the nomination for United States Senator on the Republican ticket of Henry M. Calkins, of Portland, by an estimated majority of 2250 over United States Senator Charles W. Fulton, and on the Democratic ticket of Governor Chamberlain, whose nomination was uncontested. Both successful candidates are adherents of Statement No. 1. In the first congressional district Congressman Hawley was re-nominated without contest. In the second district Congressman Ellis wins from T. T. Geer and George H. Shepherd by about 2500 plurality. Geer and Shepherd running neck and neck and A. J. Jeffrey and A. J. Derby were Democratic contestants for this office. Figures on their race are unobtainable, but it is stated the race was very close.

The Statement No. 1 candidates have swept Multnomah county, there being only one or two candidates nominated who did not subscribe to it. In the state at large enough more have been elected to make it certain that a majority of the members of the legislature will be obligated to select the candidate for United States senator who receives the greatest number of popular votes in June.
