**HOMESEEEKERS COME TO OREGON STEADILY**

DESPITE FINANCIAL STRINGENCY NUMBER IS EQUAL TO LAST YEAR'S

No considerable falling off of the colonist movement from last year's figures is shown in the reports of the last week or two from the Pullman agents and Oregon Railroad Navigation Company agents. While the expected increase did not materialize, due to the effect of last fall's financial stringency, there is still an encouraging activity in colonist travel to the Pacific Northwest. The record for the week ending April 15 showed 899 homeseekers coming through Huntington on colonist tickets.

While this appears to be a heavy falling off when compared with last year's figures for the same week, it is given a more encouraging color when it is seen that of the week's business only 14 were destined to points north of Portland, while of last year's 1147 colonist passengers coming through the Huntington gateway during that week 275 were bound for points north of Portland. The difference in the total coming to Oregon points makes the average for Portland nearly equal to that of last year.

Of the total for the week a decided gain was shown in the number of passengers to some points in Oregon. Astoria got 15 instead of last year's 11; points south of Portland secured 159, as against 69; Hood River got 11 instead of 8; The Dalles got 26 as compared to 6 for the week last year; Baker City got 21, a gain of four over a year ago; there were 27 to Walla Walla and 11 to Lewiston.

**UNSAFE TO PLANT PALMS RIGHT NOW**

John W. Hartog, manager of the Commercial Club, has received a letter from the firm of which the East Eleventh Street Improvement Club recently ordered 115 Dracene palms to plant along the curbing, in which it is stated that it is not best to plant the palms at this time of year for the reason that most of them would not live, and it is advised that the club wait till next year. If they were planted now it is probable that they would be destroyed, anyway, as the paving work will be going on for several months on that street and it would be almost impossible to protect the palms.

Enclosed were the four clipped pictures. Another letter was a mass of pencil scratches. An accompanying note from the mother explained that it was her three-and-a-half-year-old daughter's method of hoping that the babies would have a "fadder and mudder by Sunday."

**LANE COUNTY BUY BOOSTS FOR YAMHILL**

**FIRST LIGHT IN 30 YEARS**

An item from Carson City, Nevada, says:

For the first time in 30 years 12 shaggy mules saw the light of day last month at Reno, Nev. These mules were used to haul ore on the 700-foot level of the Sutro tunnel on the Comstock lode. In the future electric locomotives of the General Electric Company type will haul the ore along the underground railway.

It was in 1877 that the Sutro tunnel was first opened and the mules were taken underground. As the years passed many of the animals died, but the twelve old veterans survived to be pastured out for the rest of their lives as a fitting reward for long and faithful service.

When Virginia City was snowed in and cut off from the world in 1899, the Sutro mules saved the lives of the inhabitants. Provisions were lowered into the mouth of the tunnel, hauled five miles underground by the mules and hoisted from the Virginia shaft.

Throughout the mining districts of the West mules and burros in mine haulage work are fast being displaced by electric locomotives. These locomotives are built especially for underground work and will turn short corners and work in narrow, low-roofed tunnels even better than the animals. The electric locomotive will haul more ore and do the work quicker than the mules.

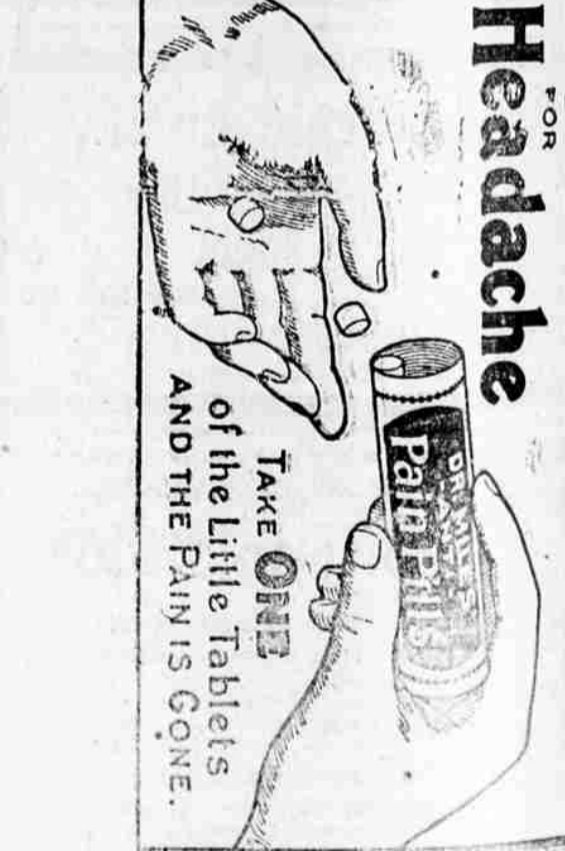
