MILITARY ROAD LAND GRANT REPORTED SOLD

CONTRACT CLOSED FOR TRANSFER OF HALF MILLION ACRES TO EASTERN SYNDICATE—LAND TO BE CUT UP AND SOLD IN SMALL TRACTS—EXTENDS ACROSS END OF STATE

A contract has been closed for the transfer and immediate colonization of the lands of the Oregon Military Land Grant Company, comprising 500,000 acres in Southern Oregon. The deal was consummated by H. A. Hunter, president of the land grant company. The grant is taken over by the corporation, to be known as the Oregon Valley Land Company of Kansas City, Mo. The consideration is about \$1,500,000.

A complete plan of colonization has been adopted, following the lines of the purchasers in the disposition and settlement last year of the San Luis Valley Land Company's large holdings in Colorado. The negotiations between President Hunter, of the Oregon grant, and the Eastern people have been under way for nearly a year, and its successful conclusion means much for the southern part of Oregon east of the Cascade mountains.

Open New Region
The great tract held for several years by members of the Booth-Kelly Company, and later by the Hunter organization, has never yet been offered to the public, and has remained practically a sealed book to the people at large, although it has for a quarter of a century been known as a quarter of vast development possibilities.

Since the last year's active campaign of surveying by Harriman railroad engineers through Central and Southern Oregon, the grant has come into notice more than ever before. It will be tapped by the Oregon Eastern Railway to be built by the Southern Pacific, and the Oregon Short Line.

The grant has for several years been held by Congressman Andrus, of Minnesota. It extends in a strip 12 miles wide from the summit of the Cascades to the Snake river opposite Silver City, Idaho. The portion involved in the transfer just made begins at the east side of the Klamath Indian reservation and includes all the lands east of that division point.

From the day the grant was made by congress in 1864 nothing has been done to encourage settlement and development. The new owners propose immediately to reverse this policy and will encourage settlement by the sale of land in small tracts.

COMMITTED SUICIDE CRAZED BY LIQUOR.

Oregon City, Ore., April 20.—"Look here," said Thaddeus Miller to his wife, and with these words he pulled the trigger of a 38-caliber Smith & Weston and sent a bullet crashing through his heart.

Miller, who would have been 31 years of age next month, lived in Milwaukee. He was a motorman on the Mount Tabor branch of the Oregon Water Power and Railway Company, and was known as a "stilt" drinker. At the inquest held tonight by Coroner Holman the testimony of the witness wife developed the fact that the unfortunate man came in from his work at 9 o'clock this morning, apparently sober, and as soon as he reached home, emptied a whiskey bottle. Then he left the house, his wife waiting for his return until nearly 11 o'clock. When he came in she upbraided him for his conduct and thus angered him.

Without eating breakfast he donned his working clothes and left the house, returning a little before two o'clock. Staggering through the door into the bedroom, there he procured his revolver and lurching to the door of the kitchen, where his wife was working. Seizing him with the gun she screamed and ran out of the back door just as he fired.

ANOTHER WAR CLOUD IN THE FAR EAST

St. Petersburg, April 20.—That the Russian detachment in Persia is in a serious position is fully confirmed tonight by the dispatches which have been received by the foreign office from the Russian commander at Yellavotgal, in Transcaucasia, ninety miles from Tiflis.

Grand Duke Nicholas Nikolavitch departed quietly from here today, traveling incognito for Crimea. The trip was ostensibly for personal reasons, and, it is said, will be of short duration. The Duke's departure, however, on the eve of the imperial family reunion for the Easter services and of the royal marriage of the Grand Duchess Marie Pavlovna to Prince Wilhelm of Sweden, is considered as an indication of a more important object. Despite diplomatic reinforcements and munitions of war to the Caucasus, the European military attaches, especially the German, are evincing great interest in the general situation and have made a number of inquiries, but the general staff reiterates that the measures are purely precautionary.

SCORE OF SMALL MILLS RESUME NEAR ELGIN, OR.

Elgin, Or., April 21.—There are 23 sawmills located near Elgin, but soon after the money flurry last year the greater number of them shut down. Last week several resumed operations, and inside of two weeks 14 more will be running. Most of the mills are small ones, employing from ten to fifteen men, but the resumption gives about 200 men work, and as all the mills are tributary to Elgin this means a great deal to the merchants here.
