### PAVING PLANT'S NARROW ESCAPE FROM FIRE

#### MIXING TANK BOILS OVER AND SETS FIRE TO WOODWORK—NEARLY AN ACCIDENT TO THE CHEMICAL ENGINE AND HOSE WAGON

This morning at 4:40 o'clock an alarm of fire was turned in from the Warren Construction Company's paving plant on Lincoln street. The firemen made a quick response and found the plant almost enveloped in flames. A line of hose was laid and soon a stream of water was playing on the blaze, quickly extinguishing it.

For some reason the paving material in one of the mixing tanks boiled over and the hot material upon striking the ground burst into flames. A woman residing near the plant threw a bucket of water on the blaze, but that made it burn all the more, and the flames shot up and soon ignited the woodwork. It was then that the alarm was turned in. The damage was slight and there was no delay in the operation of the plant.

Manager Shrewry this morning stated that several of the company's plants have burned down in just such a manner during the past few years. One in Portland burned last year, and only a few days ago another in Newark, N. J., was destroyed. Whenever water is admitted to the tanks containing the red hot paving material, no matter if it is only a very small quantity, there is not much hope of saving the plant, as the flames in most instances soon become beyond control. At the fire this morning the water was played on the flames on the ground and on the woodwork.

Nearly an Accident  
In running to the fire with the chemical engine and hose wagon Driver Taylor came near having a bad accident. As he was rounding the turn at the Hotel Gross a man stood in the middle of the street and refused to get out of the way of the team. The driver was compelled to turn to go around him, and in doing so the team ran onto the sidewalk between the hotel porch and the mable tree there, damaging the cement curbing and the porch to some extent, but not hurting the engine. The team was backed off and the run to the fire resumed with the loss of only a few seconds of time. Driver Taylor thinks the man who stood in the way was drunk.

### FAMOUS SHIP HAS BEEN FOUND IN FAR NORTH

Victoria, April 27.—Latest reports from the Far North, received by way of the police post to Dawson, confirm the word brought by Captain Jarvis, of the R. N. W. M. P., that the long forgotten exploration ship, Investigator, has freed herself from the ice and is now being towed by one of the steam whaling fleet in the direction of Behring Straits, whence it is hoped to bring her down to San Francisco and place her on exhibition as one of the greatest of marine curiosities. Afterward the salvors of the historic ship propose to tour her, believing that if properly advertised she will prove exceedingly valuable for show purposes.

It is highly improbable that there ever has been a story to parallel that of this old British warship now beating her forgotten path back to civilization for the first time since she sailed through Behring Straits into the unknown Polar seas and icy shadows more than 55 years ago. Since September 21, 1851, H. M. S. Investigator has been frozen in in Mercy bay, Baring Island, in the interminable icebergs of the Arctic sea to the north of British North America. It was as commander of this famous old ship that Sir Robert Le Mesurier McClure made his memorable voyage and discovered the Northwest Passage. In 1849 England turned loose her navy to try once more for the trail through the frozen north that had been up to that time merely a superstition bordering upon certainty.

The Investigator was then an old wooden corvette, fitted with a steam engine and carrying a row of long guns behind her white-painted port-holes. Nevertheless she was in 1849 selected to perform the hazardous feat of battling with the ice floes and bergs of the unknown North, and to form one of Captain Boucher's squadron in search of the Northwest Passage. The last that the other ships of the squadron saw of the Investigator was on August 6, 1850, when she was seen running northeast, rounding Point Barrow, in what was then Russian America, or Alaska.
