ANTHRACITE
COAL FOUND ON
LOST CREEK

SOME OF IT PICKED UP IN CREEK
BED BY R. D. PAINE AND M. F.
GRIGGS—PLACED IN COOK
STOVE AND NOT A TRACE OF
SLACK REMAINED

B. D. Paine and M. F. Griggs, who returned yesterday from a trip to Lost Creek, above Dexter, brought home with them a few pieces of coal which they picked up in the bottom of the creek. The sample left by Mr. Paine at the Eugene Gun Company's store is anthracite and looks as good as any mined in the Eastern states. Mr. Paine says that several handfuls of the coal were picked up out of the bed of the creek and placed in a cook stove while they were there and a meal for twelve persons cooked with it. Every particle of the coal was burned and not a trace of slack was left. Jos. Wilhelm, who was with Messrs. Paine and Griggs, says that considerable of this coal has been picked up in that vicinity, but that no prospecting has ever been done there. The Wilhelm coal mine, which has been developed to some extent, lies on the opposite side of the mountains from this find, and it may be that this is the same vein. Mr. Paine, who was raised in a coal producing state, says that the pieces picked up by him and his companions are the best he has ever seen in this part of the country. It might pay some one to investigate the matter and prospect for a while to see what there really is there.

MOVEMENT TO
PROTECT THE INDIANS

Riverside, Cal., April 29.—A movement to give the Indians of the Far West a square deal and to protect them from the rapacity of land-grabbers and politicians was launched here today at an interstate conference of the heads of Indian tribes, well-known educators and philanthropists.

The greatest object of the conference, which will extend through three days, is to open the eyes of the interior department and of the people to the utter incapability of the Indians to compete in a commercial way with their white neighbors. Dr. David Starr Johnson, president of Stanford University, is one of the leaders of the movement.

It is declared that thousands of Western Indians are now landless and homeless, and on the point of starvation, because of their inability to cope with the unscrupulous whites who have robbed them of their possessions. It is admitted that the effort to educate the Indians to the standards of white men's civilization—while successful in some instances—has been largely a failure and that other methods of conserving the interests of the native Americans will have to be devised.

A state convention of the California Fruit Growers' Association was also opened here today and has attracted a large number of delegates. The session will last four days.
