**BUILDING BEING
ERECTED FOR SMALL
BROOM FACTORY.**

F. O. Taylor, who recently arrived
in Eugene with his family from Gu-
therie Centre, Okla., with the inten-
tion of starting a broom factory here,
has decided to enter that business
and is erecting a small building just
north of the Luckey planing mill on
South Willamette street in which to
house his plant. The establishment
will be small at first, and the output
rather limited, but as the business
grows, as Mr. Taylor expects it to,
more machinery will be added and
the factory gradually enlarged.
There ought to be a good demand for
Eugene-made brooms if they are
equal in quality and as cheap as
those imported, and Mr. Taylor says
he can make just as good a broom
and sell it just as cheaply as the out-
side manufacturers.

**STATE TREASURER
BACK TO SALEM**

State Treasurer George A. Steel,
who has been indisposed for several
days, has so far recovered that he an-
nounces his intention of going to Sa-
lem tomorrow to attend to his official
duties, as usual. He thought at
first that he would leave the city for
the state capital this morning, but
finally concluded, on the advice of
members of his family, to allow na-
ture another day in which to make
repairs, unhandicapped by work or
worry.

Just when District Attorney Man-
ning intends filing an information
against Steel in connection with his
handling of the educational fund, is
not announced; in fact, Mr. Man-
ning himself cannot name the day.
He asserts that as soon as he has
decided definitely on the charge to
be lodged against Steel he will take
action. The nature of that charge
depends, in a measure, on what in-
formation may be furnished by T. P.
Burkhardt in case he should decide
to enter a plea of guilty to convert-
ing the educational fund of the state
to his own use as treasurer of the
Title Guarantee & Trust company.—
Portland Telegram.

**BOURNE MAY NOT GO
AS DELEGATE**

It is confidently predicted today
by the anti-Bourne Republicans that
Jonathan Bourne has lost out and
will not be one of the Oregon dele-
gates to the Republican national con-
vention at Chicago. These same peo-
ple assert, also, that neither will
Charles W. Fulton be one of the
delegates. The anti-Bourne people
have they contend, completely upset
the frame-up which Bourne had ar-
ranged in various counties of Oregon
and in Multnomah particularly.
The anti-Bourne men now say that
they have enough votes to control
the state convention, and, this being
the case, they will not make Bourne
a national delegate, and, by way of
punishing him still further, they will
instruct the delegation for Tall-
Bourne's sole hope now is in the
country, and in his ability to disor-
ganize the anti-Bourne movement,
and Bourne has always been at his
best as a disorganizer of the oppo-
sition.—Portland Telegram.

**THE GREAT CIRCUS
DRAWS LARGE CROWD**

(Roseburg News.)
The Greater Norris & Rowe circus,

Leavengood, an attorney of this city,
who has been locating people on Ore-
gon & California railroad land. The
inspectors have examined the records
at the office of the county clerk,
showing in detail the lands filed up
by Leavengood's applicants.

By means of a cleverly worded cir-
cular it is said by the investigators,
Leavengood induced scores of persons
to make applications for the purchase
of Oregon & California railroad land,
leading them to believe they would
secure the land without doubt. In
sending this literature through the
mails, Leavengood, it is stated, came
in contact with the federal statute
relating to the "use of the mails for
fraudulent purposes." He is said
to have taken in many thousands of
dollars from his operations.

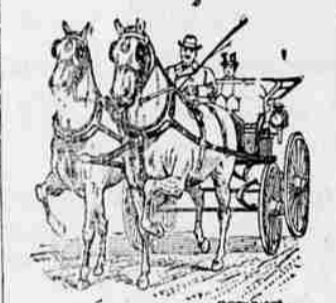
