Walla Walla, May 1.—Lewiston high school won the tri-state interscholastic field and track meet at Whitman college today in competition with fifteen other schools of the Northwest. Lewiston secured forty points. Spokane was second with 32 points, Pendleton third with 20 points, Wabburg fourth with 11 and Prosser fifth with eight points.

Ora Jay, of Pendleton, won the individual cup, securing 21 points out of the 30 made by his school.
