MEN BUY AT POLDERS

ENGINE BLOWN-UP IN BUTTE WITH LOSS OF LIFE

Butte, May 2.—The remains of Engineer Charles Hossy, killed by the blast when the Burlington eastbound express was derailed last night, was found under the engine this morning.

Carl Ming, a hobo, who carried a carpenter's union card issued at Sheridan, Wyo., died of his injuries today.

The first tangible clue was secured when the detectives traced the powder used to a mine about a mile from the scene of the explosion.

It is believed now that the entire charge was used, as the engine, one of the largest used in the mountains, was demolished.

Every person on the train has been accounted for excepting Engineer Bussy, of the second engine, who is supposed to be buried under its locomotive.

His arms and legs were broken. Fireman George Ehle, of the second engine, was badly scalded.

COUNCILMEN INSPECT CREEKS UP MCKENZIE

Mount Nebo. The source springs are protected by a heavy growth of timber, but it seems that through the middle of the watershed of the creek there is a comparative open country.

The McKenzie at Ritchie creek is about 240 feet above the base of the court house. The lower reservoir here is in the neighborhood of 180 feet above the same base, and the higher and larger about 271.

In case the three streams should ever become insufficient on account of the growth of population, other creeks with similar flows could be added to the supply by pushing the pipe line a few more miles up the river.

The intake at any of the creeks is a comparatively small matter, the situation being favorable. From the observation on the road up and back there will be but little difficulty in building the line along the south bank of the McKenzie river.

TRIANGULAR FIELD MEET GREAT SUCCESS

The triangular field meet, in which Portland high, Eugene high and the varsity freshmen participated yesterday afternoon, was a success in every way, despite the threatening weather.

Manager Bean is confident that the meet will be an annual affair in the future. As much of Oregon's track material comes from these two cities University and high school students took a keen interest in the contest and a good-sized crowd faced the threatening clouds at Kincaid field.

The varsity freshmen were the meet, as was generally expected, by a large margin, but the high school boys were in the game from start to finish, and showed up particularly well in the sprints and hurdles.

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REV. WRIGHT'S SALARY ADVANCED \$100

The Baptist church on Thursday night added \$100 to the salary of their pastor, Rev. A. C. Mr. Cockerline will make an excellent director if elected.

RESUME GRADING ON NORTHWEST ROAD

Huntington, May 1.—Three grading outfits are here and will be dispatched down the river to resume construction work on the northwest road, work on which was suspended last fall when the panic came.

Three hundred and thirty-five head of horses are here to be sent down the river. Outfits are being installed at the canyon, and at camps Nos. 2, 7 and 9. The work of grading the road to the Iron Lake will be pushed as fast as possible.
