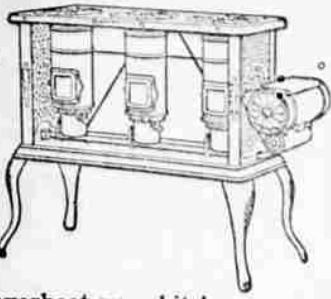

MILKING MACHINE WORKED LIKE PIANOLA

HOW A STRANGER IN OUR MIDST MILKED TWO COWS AT ONE TIME BY FOOT POWER

Something new struck town this week in the shape of a milking machine. It is a device whereby one person milks two cows at once, a pedagogue being the motive power. Cows of the kind used on the steam machine are placed on the tests, and a pump worked by the foot does the rest. Rubber tubes carry the flow of milk in the bucket suspended a safe distance from the cow's udder. Such a machine was tested the other evening, and with fairly satisfactory results. The cows were milked dry, and probably with more speed than is usual by hand. It also gave the appearance of being a more cleanly method, providing the machine be kept well sterilized. The operator sat between and cows and performed in about the same way that a University girl operates the family piano. The flow of milk into the waiting bucket was perhaps not so musical, but no less profitable. Some of those present were positive in their conclusions that if milking must be done, the pedal method offers advantages.

BANKER CROCKER SHIELDS ABE RUEF

San Francisco, April 30.—William H. Crocker, president of the Crocker National Bank and principal stockholder in the Parkside Realty Company, and Douglas M. Watson, secretary of that company, testified today in the trial of Abraham Ruef, charged with offering a bribe of \$1,000 to Jennings J. Phillips, a member of the former board of supervisors, for his vote for a trolley franchise desired by the Parkside Company.

Crocker told of speaking to Mayor Schmitz about the trolley franchise desired by his company, and receiving the mayor's assurance that he would approve it, and of subsequently talking about it to Ruef, who also was favorable to the project, and promised his aid. Crocker said he had no knowledge of his company employing Ruef as an attorney in the matter of getting the franchise from the board of supervisors; emphatically denied that the former political boss had demanded any compensation for his assistance in the matter when he talked to him about it.

The witness stated that, on the contrary, Ruef had declared he would accept no money for any aid he might be able to render him. Counsel for defense declined to cross-examine Crocker.

PROCLAMATION

Whereas, there was submitted to the people of the city of Eugene, Oregon, at a special election for that purpose on the 13th day of April, 1908, an initiative proposal after being ordained by the Common Council, pursuant to and in accordance with the general laws of the state of Oregon, for amending sections 108 and 112 of the charter of said city, and whereas there was at the same time submitted to the people of said city for their approval or rejection an initiative proposal to amend the charter of said city by adding a section thereto forbidding the establishment of cemeteries or additions thereto within the city, or the burial of human bodies therein, except under certain conditions, and

Whereas, the votes cast at said election having been this 20th day of April, 1908, duly canvassed and determined and the said amendment of said sections 108 and 112 as aforesaid having been carried by an affirmative vote of 687 as against 171 negative votes thereon.
Now, therefore, I, J. D. Matlock, mayor of said city of Eugene, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor, do hereby proclaim, announce and declare that the whole number of votes cast for and against said proposed amendments are as stated above, and that said amendments received an affirmative majority of all votes cast and that said proposed amendments, from the date hereof, be and the same are in full force and effect as a law of the city of Eugene, and a part of the charter of said city.

That said proposed amendment of the charter by adding an additional section thereto forbidding the establishment of cemeteries or additions thereto failed to receive a majority of the votes cast thereon and thereby failed to become a law of said city or a part of the charter thereof.
