SPRINGFIELD ODD FELLOWS DEDICATE THEIR NEW HALL

ABOUT THREE HUNDRED LISTEN TO ADDRESSES, MUSIC AND SEE DRILLS IN SPLENDID NEW LODGE HALL AT SPRINGFIELD—WILLIAMS GRAND MARSHAL

The Springfield Odd Fellows' temple was dedicated to the work of the great fraternal order Saturday night nearly 300 Odd Fellows and Rebekahs. About fifty were present from Eugene, representatives also attending from Coburg, Marcola, Irving, Goshen and Troy.

The ceremonies were complete and impressive, those present enjoying the famed hospitality of the Springfield organization. Hon. J. M. Williams, of this city, was grand marshal of the dedication ceremonies, and W. F. Walker, of Springfield, deputy grand master.

The address of welcome was delivered by J. J. Bryan, of the home order. Before the response could be given the firebell rang and a recess was taken, so that the fire ladders of the "sawmill city" should not miss any part of the program. Fortunately, the interruption was only a scare, and the response by George Drury, of Coburg, was heard by the whole assemblage.

Among the solos on the program was one rendered by Miss Nellie Gilbert of this city. The Springfield band, which furnished the music, was highly recommended by all present, some saying that it was much better than others twice the size.

G. A. R. NEED AID IN THEIR WORK

C. H. Baker, post commander of the G. A. R., appeals to the public in Eugene to give funds to help the work of the organization. During the last year on an average one veteran died each month, putting a heavy burden on the G. A. R. post in Eugene. In an open letter Mr. Baker says:

"The ranks of our order are rapidly thinning. Deaths in the local post have averaged one for each month the past year. G. A. R. ritualistic ceremonies and free internment are furnished for all who do not own burial lots. No soldier of the republic is permitted to be buried in the potter's field knowingly. The draft upon the finances of our order increases year by year very rapidly, and without some outside assistance it will be very difficult for the local post to do all that should be done for these aged veterans in their last days. The committee from the local post will call upon our citizens in a few days to solicit funds to help us meet the expenses incidental to the proper observance of Memorial day."
