GRANGE OPPOSES CHANGE IN THE INITIATIVE LAW

(Continued from Page One)

Ackerman addressed the grange on education.

Resolutions Adopted. A number of resolutions as follows were adopted at this afternoon's session:

Opposing the Reddy bill, which gives municipalities the right to regulate the liquor question; favoring the recall amendment to the constitution; favoring the amendment prepared by W. S. Uren, compelling all candidates for the legislature to subscribe to statement No. 1; opposing the single tax law; favoring the parcels post and postal savings banks; and it was the sense of the meeting that the grange would not support any tax efforts of the congressmen on these two measures; opposing proportional representation in the legislature; favoring the single district system of representation, and a resolution to the purport that if the S. P. land grants should revert back to the government they should be given to the state of Oregon for a forest reserve.

The following resolutions were tabled: On the amendment proposed by the Blue Mountain grange to amend the initiative law requiring a 60 per cent vote to change the constitution, and favoring county fruit examination and inspection.

- Flora—Mrs. Brown, of Lane county.
- Member of executive committee—Eugene Palmer, of Albany.
- Legislative committee—A. E. Mason, of Hood River; F. M. Gill, of Estacada.
