EUGENE PLANING MILL WILL SOON BE ENLARGED

ANOTHER STORY WILL BE ADDED TO MAIN BUILDING AND MORE MACHINERY WILL BE INSTALLED — SEVERAL MORE MEN WILL THEN BE EMPLOYED THAN AT PRESENT

The Eugene Planing Mill Company, operating the plant on Lawrence street abutting on the Southern Pacific Company's main track, has decided to make extensive additions and improvements to the plant this summer; the work to begin within a very short time. While the plans of the company are not fully matured, it is learned that a second story will be added to the main building and a large amount of new machinery added. The capacity of the plant will be increased, necessitating the employment of a number of additional men. Twelve are employed at the present time, but after the improvements are completed it is expected that there will be room for eighteen or more in and about the mill.

The proprietors of the mill are C. F. Somers, Soren Jensen and Lawrence Jensen, who established the plant about five years ago. They have built up a splendid business and are now unable to take care of all the business that offers it is for this reason that they are going to enlarge. It is probable that they will take in a new partner within a short time, but the deal has not been completed.

WILL OF DANIEL SMITH ADMITTED TO PROBATE

LEAVES HIS FARM PROPERTY TO CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN—VALUE OF ESTATE \$1,800

The will of Daniel Smith, the old pioneer, who died at Franklin on May 4 at the age of 99 years, was admitted to probate today. The estimated value of the property of the estate is \$1,800, consisting of a farm at Franklin. Henry T. Smith, a son, by the terms of the will, is appointed executor of the estate without bonds, and Herman Ray, H. L. Morris and Delbert Proctor are appointed appraisers.

The will bequeaths to the son, Henry T. Smith, the south half of the Job Hinton donation land claim in section 32, township 16, south of range 3 west; to the daughter, Edie Jane Howard, 20 acres of land north of the Smith donation claim; to Lillie, Sadie and Roy Driskill, children of the daughter, Phoebe Driskill, deceased, 18 1/2 acres; to the son, Benjamin Smith, \$5; to the grandson, Thomas Smith, \$10; all the remainder to Hazel and Clyde Smith, children of Benjamin Smith.

WILL ASK COUNCIL FOR MORE PAVEMENT
