PROF. LETCHER MARRIED AT NORFOLK VA.

John D. Letcher, formerly professor of mathematics at the University of Oregon, and now a civil engineer at Norfolk, Va., has become a benefactor. The following is from the Norfolk Landmark: "Miss Louisa Leach and Taylor has issued invitations to a small reception to be given at her home on Perbrooke avenue, on Wednesday evening, May 13th, from 8 to 11 o'clock, which is the evening preceding the ceremony of her marriage to John Letcher, which takes place at noon the following day at the beautiful residence of the bride's parent. The ceremony will be performed by Bishop A. M. Randolph and Archdeacon John Lloyd, and will be attended only by the immediate family and a few intimate friends. Miss Taylor is the daughter of the late Taskewell Taylor, who was one of the most brilliant and eminent members of the bar, not only of Norfolk, but of the state. She is prominent in the social life of Norfolk. Mr. Letcher, formerly of Lexington, Va., is a civil engineer and is engaged professionally at this time in Norfolk. He is the son of Governor John Letcher, who was once governor of the state, and an eminent statesman of his day. Immediately following the wedding Mr. Letcher and his bride will leave for a Southern trip and will sail on May 30th for New York, where they will spend the summer traveling and attend the Anglican church conference, both being delegates from Southern Virginia."

SHE WILL PRESIDE AT FESTIVAL AT FLORENCE THIS WEEK—OTHER LOWER SUSLAW NOTES

Laura Johnson received the highest number of votes for queen of the rhododendron festival at Florence this week. The vote was as follows: Margaret Brund, 5; Lillian Bernhardt, 10; Gertrude Hamble, 20; Hester Hurd, 30; Isabele Kyle, 60; Flossie Chapman, 620; Ethel Munroe, 780; Emma Brund, 3390; Laura Johnson, 6820. The total number of votes cast was 11,740, of which Laura Johnson received the highest number. She was declared elected queen of the rhododendron festival. The schooner Mayflower sailed Wednesday for San Francisco with a cargo of lumber from the Suslaw Lumber Company's mill.

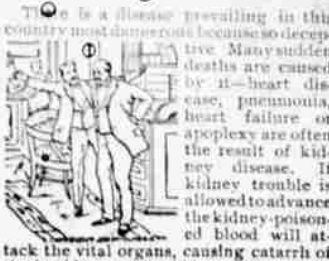
The steamer Roscoe, which went to Astoria some weeks ago to have the boiler repaired, came back to Florence Saturday evening.
