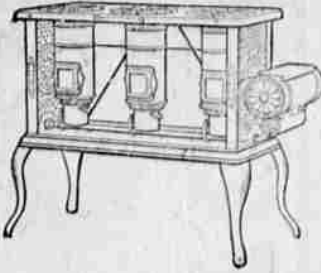

TRACK MEET IN EUGENE NEXT FRIDAY AFTERNOON

The second greatest athletic event of the year takes place next Friday afternoon on Kincaid field when the O. A. C. track and field men will try to wrest from the University the championship of the Northwest in the course standard events.

O. A. C. showed herself considerably weaker at the Columbia indoor meet in Portland, but as the Oregon team has just had a hard trip to the inland Empire, the O. A. C. aggregation has strong hopes of coming out winner.

To succeed "Dad" Trine of O. A. C., Trainer Heater, formerly of Willamette, and an old Oregon student and athlete, was chosen last fall and is training the Agries. All winter he has been working on his runners, his sprinters, and his weight tossers.

The feeling will be intense Friday for O. A. C., administered to the local collegians, the first football defeat last fall. Oregon ever sustained on Kincaid field after it was rebuilt and also dealt out two decisive defeats in basket ball last winter.

The O. A. C. baseball team is very strong, report naming it as the premier bunch of amateur hitters in the state. Their fielding, however, is said to be less steady than Oregon's, and therefore it is a question just how the results will stand Saturday night.

BELLE GUNNESS' MURDER FORTUNE

La Porte, Ind., May 18.—In her campaign of murder Mrs. Belle Guinness is said to have carried on a very profitable "business," which, according to the latest figures obtainable netted her \$55,000.

M. Sorenson, first husband, life insurance, \$8000. Peter Guinness, second husband, life insurance, \$4000.

John E. Moe, Elbow Lake, Minnesota, \$1500. Andrew K. Helgelin, Aberdeen, South Dakota, \$2900.

George Berry, Tuscola, Illinois, \$1500. Henry Gerhalt, Iola, Wisconsin, \$1000.

From fire insurance on Guinness home in Chicago, \$3500. In addition to these sums Mrs. Guinness is supposed to have received \$1000 each from four men whose bodies were found on the "murder" farm, and \$1000 each from fifteen men with whom the woman had been corresponding.

The authorities have failed so far to learn what the woman did with this money. It is thought the \$720 which she put in the bank shortly before her home was consumed by the flames was all the money that was left. It is likely she invested most of the money she took from her victims in real estate.

Tuesday, July 7, 1908, and that said proposals will be opened and considered by the council at said time.

That the city of Eugene proposes to sell the said three hundred thousand dollars of water bonds to the highest bidder therefor in denominations of from one hundred to one thousand dollars, as the purchaser may desire; that said bonds are to bear interest at the rate bid, not to exceed 5 per cent per annum; said interest payable semi-annually on the first day of July and January of each year from their date until paid; that said three hundred thousand dollars of water bonds will become due and payable by the city of Eugene as follows: On the first day of January, 1948, principal and interest payable at a place to be agreed upon by purchaser and city.
