In early days Mr. Casey was a partner in a blacksmith shop for a time with the late David Thompson, afterward prominent as the surveyor of much of Eastern Oregon, capitalist and Republican politician. They have lived continuously over fifty years on their farm near Woodburn, and have the distinction of being the only pioneer couple in that part of Marion county both living.
