Taylor, the Oregon backstop, was remarkably steady in the receiving department, but permitted his opponents to make two tallies on bad throws.

The Oregon men played hard but showed, it seemed, a lamentable lack of accuracy, as though they had been loafing in practice. One of the pleasantest things of the evening was the chivalry of the Farmers. Feeling was running high over a dispute, the hair on the backs of the rooters of both the college and O. football tackle, quietly slipped from the grand stand and gathered the O. A. C. rooters together and gave a vociferous Oregon yell.
