Captain Ellmaker, of the Eugene team, being aware of the fact that it will be a hard struggle for the championship banner, is mustering all the good men available in the high school. Adam Creiger, who ran the 100-yard dash in 19 2-5 seconds last Saturday, is expected to clip off another fifth of a second tomorrow. Ellmaker will attempt his broad-jumping stunt, as well as several other events in spite of the fact that he has a badly sprained ankle.

As for the Salem men, it will be well worth the price of admission to see such men as Kay and Vinton perform. Kay runs the 220-yard dash in 23 1-5 seconds, and Vinton in the distances is decidedly a star.
