**J. O. STOREY BUYS MORE EUGENE PROPERTY**  
**L. R. ALDERMAN RETAINED AS HEAD OF SCHOOLS**

**AND WILL EXTEND HIS THOUGHTFUL REPERFOR BREEDING FARM—OTHER SALES**

E. J. Frasier, general manager of the Lane County Land & Investment Company, returned from Portland yesterday, and while there closed a deal with J. O. Storey for the Rickman farm, containing 520 acres, and lying three miles southwest of Eugene. Mr. Frasier did not give out the figures but it is understood to be in the neighborhood of \$15,000. This makes a most valuable addition to the 381 acres Mr. Frasier recently sold to Mr. Storey for \$23,800. It is the best thoroughbred Hereford breeding farm in Western Oregon. As a nucleus he has already secured about 20 head from the best noted studs on the coast, including two cows imported from England.

While in Portland yesterday Mr. Frasier also sold a very valuable property to Jonathan Johnson for \$11,400. Mr. Johnson is the gentleman to whom Mr. Frasier recently sold the Storey residence property in Portland for \$10,000, and the Dunn farm, 1 1/2 miles southeast of Eugene, for \$17,250, also the Whitney farm of 381 acres adjoining Eugene on the southwest for \$15,875.

Although Mr. Johnson is making some pretty large investments in Portland he still intends to make his home in Eugene, and has great faith in the future of the city.

Including the Levinger farm at Springfield, which Mr. Frasier just sold to William Beale, from California, for \$20,000, and the Leah place for \$2600, it brings his total recent sales up to the handsome figure of \$71,605. This does not include minor deals in town lots and city property.
