official returns are canvassed. From  
the returns at hand, however, it is  
possible to state with reasonable accu-  
racy the results. The pluralities for

**TOWN OF STITES, IDAHO,  
SUFFERS FROM FLOOD**

Lewiston, Ida., June 4.—The town  
of Stites, located on the Clearwater  
river, 70 miles above Lewiston, is  
swept by a flood today as the result  
of continued warm rain for the past  
48 hours. The business and residence  
sections are practically vacated, and  
a raging torrent four feet deep is  
rushing through the streets. Build-  
ings are badly flooded and a number  
have been thrown from their founda-  
tions. A further rise of one foot will  
keep half the town down the river.  
Stites is a railroad town of 1000 peo-  
ple, located at the Clearwater ter-  
minal of the Northern Pacific rail-  
road. The damage by water is im-  
possible to determine at this time,  
but is known to aggregate many  
thousand dollars. The flood waters  
reached Lewiston shortly before noon  
and the river is now rising at the rate  
of six inches an hour.
