CITY COUNCIL HOLDS REGULAR MONTHLY SESSION

The regular meeting of the city council was held last night with Councilman Williams, president of the council, in the chair in the absence of Mayor Matlock, and the following business was transacted:

The finance committee reported on the claim of Frank Kelsay and Willard Young for \$2990.56 still due on plans for electric light and water systems and on which they agreed to accept \$2500 within a reasonable time. The report is that the city is liable for a reasonable sum, but the committee had not consulted the engineer as to what was such sum. It was referred again to the fire and water committee, the finance committee and the mayor, to report on it again Monday night.

The proposition of Mr. Reynolds to make a street of dedication for a part of the street at the corner of Fourteenth and Willamette streets was accepted.

The matter of dedication of part of West Seventh street was referred to the street committee.

The putting in of a 2 1/2 inch water pipe on Olive street was referred to the fire and water committee and the street committee.

The Warren Construction Company was given the rental of the steam roller at \$5 per day.

The city surveyor reported on the cost of putting in a sewer between Second and Third streets as probably worth \$3000 or more. The estimate for the sewer of 1447 feet between West Fifth and West Sixth streets was presented, and also on East Twelfth street, between Alder and Hilyard, also the Thirteenth street sewer. The city attorney was instructed to draft the proper ordinance for these sewers. The chairman of the sewer committee reported that plumbers are cutting into sewer pipes at other places than where a "Y" is located. The marshal was instructed to notify the plumbers to comply with the ordinance in this respect.

The matter of changing the width of paving of East Fifth street was referred to the street committee, to report to the city attorney for an amendment to the ordinance.

Reports of committees were read, bills allowed and other minor matters attended to. The council adjourned to meet next Monday night.

NEW CLUB HOUSE FOR UNIVERSITY GIRLS

J. E. Yarnall, of this city, has recently bought a lot on Alder street from Professor F. S. Dunn, adjoining the latter's residence at the corner of East Fourteenth and Alder streets, and will erect there this summer a clubhouse for the Kiosche Tileum sorority, composed of University girls who are now occupying the larger house owned by the Old Folks' Home of the Christian church on East Twelfth street. Plans for the building are now being completed by Architect John Hunzicker, and as soon as they are completed so that the contractors can figure on the building the contract will be let. The house will cost in the neighborhood of \$6,500, and will be two stories and a half high, with a full basement. It will contain all the latest conveniences and appointments and will be a splendid home for this popular sorority.

WOMEN WALKS MILES PUSHING A CART

SAYS HER HUSBAND DESERTED HER AND LEFT HER TO TAKE CARE OF HERSELF AND CHILDREN

A pitiful case of destitution and want is that of a woman and three little children who have been in Eugene since yesterday, having walked all the way here from somewhere in Marion county, where she says her husband deserted her, leaving her without any means of support. The woman, whose name is not learned, her whereabouts today not being known, arrived here yesterday afternoon with what few effects she could gather when she was turned out of her home, in a push cart. She traveled along the county roads and depended upon what little work she could obtain from persons along the route for the money with which to keep herself and children alive. She is said to be on her way to California, where she has relatives. The county authorities will probably look into the case if the woman can be found. She is said to have camped last night over across the river bridge.

- Olive street, from Fifth street to Tenth street.
- Fifth street, from Olive street to Oak street.
- Sixth street, from Olive street to Oak street.
- Tenth street, from Olive street to Willamette street.
- Tenth street from Willamette street to Oak street.
- Eleventh street, from Willamette street to Olive street.
- Oak street, from Seventh street to Ninth street.

All in the city of Eugene. The common council requires that separate bids be submitted for each of the above designated streets, and does hereby notify all bidders that separate contracts for the improvement of each of said streets will be required.

Bidders will state price in detail, in accordance with specifications prepared by the city of Eugene, and now on file in the office of the city recorder. All work to be done under the supervision of the street committee to their satisfaction, and to be approved by them. All contractors will be required to furnish an approved bond in a sum to be agreed upon for the faithful performance of his or their contract. And all bidders shall include with each bid a certified check in a sum equal to 5 per cent of the amount bid, payable to J. D. Matlock, Mayor.

The street committee reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
