COMMERCIAL CLUB DISCUSSES MANY THINGS

The regular monthly meeting of the Commercial Club was held last night, at which time a number of important matters were taken up and discussed.

The matter of a county exhibit at the Oregon building at the Seattle exposition next year was brought up and referred to the state fair committee.

Dr. D. A. Paine, C. S. Williams, G. D. Linn, W. M. Green and John H. Hartog were appointed to go to Portland to interview the S. P. officials and Tom Richardson in regard to the proposed excursion of Portland people to Eugene on June 24. The committee will go down on the noon train tomorrow.

A resolution committee consisting of D. A. Paine, Jack Rodman and L. L. Whitson was appointed for the state teachers' association, which meets here on June 25.

S. H. Friendly, D. A. Paine, D. E. Yoran and Judge Harris were appointed as a committee on decorations during commencement week.

E. O. Potter was appointed a committee of one to interview the mayor in regard to setting a time for a cleaning-up day before commencement week.

The matter of proper ingress from the city to the depot grounds after improvements which are now going on are completed was brought up. Manager Hartog presented a map of the grounds showing a strip of ground forty feet wide extending along Third street from Pearl to Charnelton, which the S. P. proposes to set aside as a road for convenience of warehousemen, provided a short strip of ground is given by the city to connect this strip with the street on the north. A committee was appointed to bring the matter before the council.

Mr. Hartog also brought up the matter of a better road from Eugene to the Siuslaw country.

COURT PETITIONS GOVERNMENT TO IMPROVE SIUSLAW

I. D. Cushman, the Acme Insurance man and capitalist, has been in the city for the past few days in the interest of the matter of bonding the western end of Lane county for \$100,000 for the purpose of improving the bar at the mouth of the Siuslaw river, an outline of the scheme having been given by The Guard over a week ago. Yesterday he induced the county commissioners' court to issue an order petitioning the government for permission to make the improvements. The petition is as follows:

"To the Board of Engineers of River and Harbor Improvements, War Department, Washington, D. C. 'Gentlemen:—For and on behalf of the citizens and residents of Lane county, Oregon, we, the undersigned, the county court of Lane county, Oregon, do most respectfully petition for and request permission from the department to improve the mouth of the Siuslaw river in said county, and more particularly for permission to construct the south jetty. Said improvements to be made in conformity to the surveys and report made thereon by W. C. Langfitt, in 1903, and the expenses of said improvement to be born by the residents and citizens of said county."
