MORNING FIRE BRINGS OUT DEPARTMENT

FIRE TEAM WAS ON SWEEPER AND PASSENGER TRAIN BLOCKED STREET—DAMAGE SMALL.

At 6 o'clock this morning a fire alarm was sounded, a call having come in from the northwestern part of the city. The fire team, which was on the street sweeper at the time, but happened to be within a few yards of the engine house, was transferred to the chemical engine and a quick run was made, but before its arrival at the scene of the fire—in the residence of John Peterson, at 295 Jefferson street—the blaze had been extinguished with several buckets of water. When the engine reached the railroad on Jefferson street, a passenger train was standing there, completely blocking the street, and it was necessary to wait several minutes before it moved. However, the fire had been put out in the meantime.

It is not known how the fire originated. Mrs. Peterson was preparing breakfast when she noticed smoke in the front room. A pair of portiers was afire and the blaze was spreading all over the ceiling. She called to her husband, who was in the rear yard, and by hard work they succeeded in subduing the flames. A hole in the ceiling and the roof was burned, but the damage is nominal.

PIONEER RESIDENCE NOW BEING MOVED

BUILDING OCCUPIED BY LAKE'S MARBLE SHOP WAS BUILT IN EARLY FIFTIES

The building occupied by E. C. Lake's marble shop, now being moved from the corner of Sixth and Willamette streets, where Cherry Bros. fine new concrete building is to be erected, was at one time a residence and was one of the first built in Eugene. An old-time citizen tells The Guard that it was built early in the fifties, about '52, he thinks. A man named Pierce built it on the old Lauer property, now owned by F. L. Chambers and on which his two-story brick building occupied by the Independence creamery stands. About the year 1875 the building was moved to the corner of Sixth and Willamette streets, where it was used as a dwelling house until only a few years ago, when it was transformed into a store building and has been occupied by Lake's marble shop since. It is now being moved to James Sanford's lot on East Seventh street, between Willamette and Oak.
