## MEXICAN TROOPS ARE AFTER YAQUIS INDIAN BANDS

Tucson, Ariz., June 12.—A special dispatch from Hermosillo, Mexico, says that 4000 Mexican soldiers are in hot pursuit of the Yaqui Indians. All negotiations looking to the signing of a peace treaty were suddenly broken off when the Yaquis insisted on retaining their arms and ammunition, after having acceded to every other stipulation of the Mexican government.

The Mexican soldiers have all the water holes in the Yaqui country surrounded, and it is not believed that the campaign will last long.
