EUGENE COMPANY BUYS CORVALLIS LUMBER PLANT

SUNSET COMPANY TAKES OVER SAWMILL OF CORVALLIS LUMBER COMPANY—WILL SECURE LOGS OVER CARVER'S NEW RAILROAD, WHICH WILL TAP ALSEA TIMBER BELT

H. C. Mahon, president and manager of the Sunset Lumber Company, which owns the sawmill on the Mohawk, formerly the Hyland mill, and a great deal of timber land in that vicinity and in other parts of Lane county, returned today from Corvallis, where he closed a deal for the purchase by his company of the Corvallis Lumber Company's mill at that city. The deal was consummated yesterday, and the property turned over to the new owners this morning.

The mill at Corvallis is said to be one of the best small plants in the state and has been operated for a number of years at a good profit to its owners. The mill has a capacity of 30,000 feet of lumber per day, and employs twenty men. Included in the deal is considerable valuable city property in Corvallis. The consideration is not given out for publication.

Mr. Mahon informed a Guard reporter this afternoon that his company will secure logs for the Corvallis plant from the Alsea timber belt over Carver's new railroad which he is building from Corvallis west into the Coast mountains. About fifteen miles of the road have already been completed, and the work is being pushed as rapidly as possible.

Mr. Mahon, besides being president and manager of the Sunset Lumber Company, is the largest stockholder. The headquarters of the company are in Eugene.
