Bryson, Justice of the Peace in and for Eugene Justice District, Lane County, Oregon, and J. L. Clark, Justice of the Peace in and for Creswell Precinct, Lane County, Oregon, that at the said election the total number of votes cast in the precinct of Springfield, in Lane county, Oregon, on the question, "For and Against stock running at large," is and was 232 votes, and the said number of votes cast in the said Springfield precinct "Against stock running at large" is and was 286 votes. It appearing from said abstract that the result of said vote is and was 232 votes against stock running at large, and that the majority against stock running at large in said Springfield precinct is and was 232 votes.

Therefore, in compliance with Section 4245 of the General Laws of Oregon, passed by the legislature of the state of Oregon in the year 1907, notice is hereby given that after 60 days from the date of this notice it will be unlawful for stock to run at large in said Springfield precinct, Lane County, Oregon, under penalty of \$10 for the first offence and \$20 for each and every subsequent offence, to be recovered from the owner of the stock in civil action in the name of the State of Oregon before a justice of the peace of the precinct in which such owner or keeper, or either of them, may reside, and such penalty shall be for the benefit of, and when collected paid into, the common school fund of the county in which such action is brought within sixty days after such animal is proved to be at large.

REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION MEETS

(Continued From Page One.)

with a big banner with a picture of Taft lithographed upon it. There was cheering and the band struck up "Hall to the Chief," but the demonstration was not a sustained one. The Taft banner was not allowed to remain in the hall, but was taken to a side room.

A flashlight picture of the gathering was then taken.

Details of First Session

Chairman New spoke briefly, pointing out the achievements of the Republican administration during the past 12 years, especially commending the policies of President Roosevelt.

Mention of the name of Roosevelt caused an outburst of cheers which, however, lasted but a few seconds.

Chairman New introduced Bishop Muldoon, of Chicago, who recited the Lord's prayer.

Secretary Malloy read the call for the convention, and his fine delivery aroused considerable applause.

Chairman New then announced that the national committee had recommended Senator J. C. Burrows, of Michigan, for temporary chairman, and Burrows was warmly received. He bowed his acknowledgment and at 12:34 began his key note address.

He had been speaking about six minutes when he came to the first mention of Roosevelt's name. At once a demonstration began. One by one the delegations took up the cheering until the applause was general.

At the mention of Fairbanks' name there was more cheering.

Senator Burrows completed his remarks at 1:42, and at 2:03 the convention adjourned until noon tomorrow.

Injunction Trouble.

Up to a late hour last night, and again early this morning, and throughout the day and after the adjournment of the preliminary session, the leaders continued their work upon matters remaining to be settled. Platform polishing and more especially the sharp controversy over the plank having reference to the limitation of court injunctions in labor disputes, went on. Planks of the widest interest, the tariff, railroad legislation, currency reform, endorsement of the administration of Roosevelt have been fully or substantially agreed upon. Speaker Cannon, backed by prominent leaders of various states, continue their vigilant opposition to any radical utterance on the injunction question, and the lines are more sharply drawn upon that subject than any other.

Roosevelt Stampede.

The manner in which the name of Roosevelt will be presented to the convention for renomination has not been disclosed, but that it will be especially the sharp controversy over the movement will be an un-falling topic for conjecture, and the explosive possibilities of its injection at the psychological moment are fully realized by all concerned. Close friends of President Roosevelt and Secretary Taft, on the ground, declare themselves prepared to meet it, in whatsoever form it arises, with convincing proofs that Roosevelt views any such attempt with a disapproval so emphatic as to leave no room for doubt of its tolerance.
