The grand jury this forenoon returned three indictments for selling liquor, the case was held over for further proceedings. E. Bristow, Howard Pope, C. H. Bianton, Loren Edwards, M. H. Harlow, Wm. P. Drury, Jos. Strome, Albert Erdman, T. B. Davidson.

**Parmenter Pleads Guilty.**  
David Parmenter, the alleged bigamist, this morning withdrew his plea of not guilty and entered a plea of guilty. Time for sentence was set for Saturday at 10 a. m.

F. H. Cook vs. L. L. Williams; to recover money. Motion to strike out amended complaint sustained. Plaintiff given permission to file second amended complaint.

Mathias Wilhelm vs. Island Spence; Anna Spence; Eucery Justice and Louis Mullin; forcible detainer. Decree of foreclosure; judgment for \$1396, interest at 8 per cent from September 24, 1906; attorney fee of \$120.
