ITALIAN WINE MERCHANT KILLS THREE OUTLAWS

New Orleans, June 17.—Following a series of crimes attributed to the so-called "Black Hand" of the Italian quarter in New Orleans, one of the worst tragedies connected with that section took place early today, when three Italians were shot to death by Pietro Giacoma, a wealthy Italian wine merchant.
Giacoma and his son told the police that the three men frequently bought wine by the barrel and refused to pay for it. Yesterday they bought a barrel and ordered it shipped to a point in the state. The men returned early today and ordered them to prepare a meal. The elder Giacoma, suspecting trouble, had hidden a rifle and when one of the visitors drew a revolver and ordered them to produce their money and valuables, the other Giacoma commenced firing, killing all three of the intruders.
One of the dead men has been identified, and has a police record.

Mrs. Nancy J. Renshaw, a Lane county pioneer, having come here early in the 50's, died at Seattle June 11, at the age of nearly 85 years. The funeral was held the next day. Mrs. Renshaw was a sister of the late J. B. Stowell and was known by all old-time residents of Eugene and Lane county.
