PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF SUN NEXT SUNDAY MORNING.
There will be a partial eclipse of the sun on the morning of June 28. It will take place in this state in the morning from 6:29 to 7:32 o'clock. The eclipse will assume various shapes as it is viewed from different parts of the globe. Here about one third of the surface of the sun will be obscured. The moon passes between the earth and the sun and casts out a large circular piece of its brilliance. In other parts of the country the phenomenon will take the shape of a ring eclipse. In other words, the moon will come in exact line between the earth and the sun, obscuring the whole of the orb except the rim, which will shine out in a perfect ring of light.
When the moon is closer to the earth it blackens the visage entirely and temporarily hangs a pall over the earth. At present it is too far away to intercept the whole of the sun's rays.
The ring will not be visible in this state but the annular eclipse will be worth seeing.

OFFICIAL STATE VOICE IS CANVASSED
Salem, June 22.—The formal official canvass of the returns of the recent election was made today by the Governor and Secretary of State, and the figures heretofore published confirmed. Under date of June 23, Governor Chamberlain will issue proclamations declaring in full force and effect those measures which received an affirmative majority vote. The acts and amendments adopted will be in effect from the time of the proclamations. Those which will be proclaimed as adopted are the amendment permitting the scattering of state institutions, the November election amendment, the sheriff's custody of prisoners bill, the University appropriation bill, the recall, proportional representation, Statement No. 1 instruction to the legislature, the corrupt practice act, the grand jury amendment and Hood River county bill.

STATE RIFLE SHOOT ON SALEM RANGE
Through the untiring efforts of Captain Charles A. Murphy, of Company M, Oregon National Guard, Salem has finally been chosen as the place for the state military rifle tournament to be held sometime in the middle of July.
Adjutant-General Finzer, representing the governor, accompanied by Major Baker, of the headquarters staff, of Portland, were in the city yesterday and in company with Captain Murphy and Lieutenant Carl Abrams, visited the range across the river for the purpose of estimating the amount of additional necessary equipment and making a final decision as to the fitness of the grounds—Salem Statesman.
