Another meeting of the city council was held last night with Mayor Matlock and Councilmen Barrett, Fisher, Moon, Harbaugh, Williams and Roach present.
The ordinance levying assessments for the sewer in the alley between East Eleventh and East Twelfth streets, from Pearl to High was passed.

Councilman Moon reported that the street committee had contracted with Sam Manerud to do the sprinkling, cleaning and sweeping of the streets at \$60 per month, the city to furnish the water.

Councilman Roach reported that Housemover Barringer wants the privilege of cutting down a large tree on East Twelfth street and burning down some brush on the same street so that he could move a house. The matter was referred to the street committee.

The bridge across the slough on Jefferson street was referred to the street committee.

The billposter ordinance was taken up and after some corrections, was passed. It provides that all billposters over 15 years of age who work for hire must take out a license.
