FATHER OF E. DODGE DIES AT WOODBURN

Francis Marion Dodge, father of E. Dodge, the Eugene merchant, died at Woodburn a few days ago. A news dispatch from that city says: "Francis Marion Dodge, a pioneer of 1842 and Indian war veteran, who died here June 22, was a native of Pennsylvania, being born in Crawford county, October 29, 1842. His father crossed the plains to Oregon in 1842. In 1858 he enlisted under Gen. Gilmore Hayes for service in the Cayuse Indian War, and took part in the engagements at White River, South Prairie, Council Prairie and Walla Walla, and was a member of Shaw's train when it was captured. On being mustered out, a year later, he became a school teacher and taught for a number of years, investing his earnings in property in and about Portland.

In 1865 Mr. Dodge was married to Jane Caples, a native of Andrew County, Missouri, who survives him. Six children were born to them, four of whom are living, J. E. Dodge, of Woodburn; E. Dodge of Eugene; Mrs. Lizzie Pugh of Oregon City, and Walter Dodge of Woodburn.

OLD VETERANS GATHER AT NEWPORT.

Newport, Or., June 24.—Hundreds of grizzled veterans gathered this morning at the Casino for actual work of encampment says the Portland Journal of the Grand Army, out of the grand old men in passing on delegates and issuing badges. The council of administration met to work on financial business. The principal interest centers in the fight being made by Corvallis and McMinnville for the next encampment. Each town has a strong delegation here to offer inducements, and is confident of victory.

There are six leading candidates for department commander to succeed S. E. Rye. They are George A. Harding, Oregon City; J. P. Apperson, Oregon City; G. W. Montague, Arlington; Danier Webster, Sateau; W. J. R. Beach, Forest Grove; E. Swan, Portland. The candidates for senior vice commander promise a vigorous fight.

The town is filling fast. Six hundred arrived last evening from Portland. At Philadelphia they were welcomed with flowers by the citizens.

Grant Hyland is moving his family to his farm above Rush Island, from Eugene, where they will reside until fall.

Charles Mettee is building a new barn on his farm near Rush Island. Grant Hyland is also building a new barn.

Fishing parties have put in their appearance and several boats have passed Lowell going up the middle fork.

The late rains have done a wonderful lot of good to vegetation of all kinds. Fruit is also looking fine.

Cattle men are taking their heads to their summer ranges. There has been several hundred head driven past of late.
