A. R. Black, the irrigation engineer, left this afternoon, in company with several workmen and taking a large wagon load of supplies for the site of the proposed irrigation reservoir at Waldo Lake, where the work which has already begun some time ago will be prosecuted with vigor. As announced a few days ago in The Guard, it is pretty certain that outside capital has been interested in this project, and the work will proceed from now on with even greater energy than before when Mr. Black was interested alone in the matter.

## IRRIGATION FOR UPPER VALLEY AS EXPERIMENT

should have moisture and he concludes the Willamette valley must be irrigated.

The report is replete with tables giving information as to the streamflow of the rivers of the Willamette valley including the Tualatin, Molalla, Santiam, Clackamas, Luckiamute, McKenzie, Yamhill and other smaller streams. The tables give the average rainfall, the yearly and summer discharge of the streams, resulting in almost ideal conditions for perfect irrigation.

## Reservoirs Are Proposed.

It is set forth that the Willamette valley is very easily irrigated. Reservoirs could be filled by the heavy winter rains and would supply the whole valley for the six or eight weeks when there is no rain.

Districts are cited in Italy and in other parts of the world where the rainfall is almost as great as it is in the Willamette Valley, but where irrigation is regarded as indispensable, invariably the rainfall is more evenly distributed than in the Willamette valley. Observations were made by Mr. Stover from the farms of Oswald West and Robert Gellatly near Corvallis; George Bagley and A. M. Stanton near Hillsboro, and Cockermine & Howard near Albany. Upon these farms irrigation has been tried on a small scale. At Corvallis irrigated plats are taken side by side so that Mr. Stover's conclusions are accurate.

## Dairying Possibilities Good.

Dairying, Mr. Stover says, is probably the coming industry of the Willamette valley, but it can never be developed to its fullest extent without irrigation. According to the government expert irrigation is absolutely necessary to prevent the valley from becoming absolutely barren.

Formerly the government directed its efforts largely to the irrigation of large areas in the unsettled parts of the state, in order to attract settlers. Now more work will be done in the more thickly settled parts.
