## MUCH SNOW IN BOHEMIA MINING DISTRICT YET

HERBERT LEIGH, MINING ENGINEER, SAYS THERE IS MORE THAN HE HAS EVER SEEN AT THIS TIME OF THE YEAR—GREAT ACTIVITY IN THE DISTRICT THIS SUMMER.

Herbert Leigh, the well-known mining engineer, returned a few days ago from the Bohemia mines where he had been for several weeks looking after his properties in the district to a reporter last evening he stated that he has leased a part of the Noonday boarding house to the Mayflower company who put 15 men to work on the Noonday road, putting it in shape for the summer's traffic. The Mayflower people are putting in a saw mill and will install a reduction plant this summer.

Mr. Leigh says the indications are bright for greater activity in the district this summer than for several years past, and several valuable bodies of ore have been uncovered lately. Just before he left the district he heard of a splendid find of milling ore at the Sunrise mine. The company is completing a road to connect their property with the main wagon road.

There is more snow in the district at this time, Mr. Leigh says, than there has been at any previous time this season since he became interested there. Upon leaving Eugene mountain a few days ago, he had to go through three miles of snow along the ridge which was from five to ten feet deep. Generally at this time of the year the snow is nearly all off.

## COMMITTEES OF SCHOOL BOARD ARE NAMED

At a recent meeting of the school board the board reorganized, electing Dr. W. L. Cheshire chairman. The following committees were appointed: Teachers—McMurphy and Hull. Purchasing—Hull and Moran. Buildings and Grounds—Moran and Allen.

Finance—Allen and McMurphy. Miss Emily Muhr and Lola Levin were elected teachers in the high school. Miss Cora Wold has tendered her resignation as teacher in the school to accept a similar one in the Portland high school.

The salary of Miss Edith Prescott, teacher of music in the schools, was advanced from \$40 to \$50 a month. William Judkins was chosen janitor of the Patterson school at \$40 a month.

## SOLDIER GETS 20 CENTS AFTER FORTY YEARS.

William Young, a Civil War veteran, has received at the Soldiers' Home, a check for 20 cents from the Treasury Department, the amount of change due him, when 40 years ago, he purchased 5 cents worth of paper, and received no change when he tendered a quarter therefor.

## REDISTRIBUTING NATIONAL FOREST RESERVES OF WEST

(Guard Special Service.)  
Washington, July 1.—The second step in the comprehensive plan of redistributing the national forests in the western states has just been made by the president in signing executive orders which will change the names and boundaries of the forests of Oregon. The only other state in which these plans have been completed is Idaho, but it is expected that the work of redistributing in all the national forest states will be finished and the changes announced in the next few days.

No addition to forest area is involved in the plans for redistributing in any of the states of the Northwest. The object of the work is to equalize the areas of administrative units and to arrange their boundaries in a such a manner as to promote the most efficient and practical administration of the forests. It will enable officers of the forest service to give prompt attention to all forest business and further the interests and add to the convenience of stockmen, lumbermen, miners and all other users of settlers in the national forests. The Oregon National Forests which will be affected by this rearrangement in Western Oregon are as follows:

The Fremont National Forest will consist of the southern portion of the old "Fremont," and all of the "Goose Lake" Forests and is located in Lake, Klamath and Wheeler counties. This forest is irregular in outline and is composed of many segregated areas, the total area of which will be 1,236,960 acres. It will continue to be under the administration of Supervisor Guy M. Ingram, with headquarters at Lakeview, Oregon.

The land formerly included in the "Bull Run" and the "Cascade (N)" Forest, except that portion south of the Willamette Valley Cascade Mountain Wagon Road, covering 1,788,320 acres, will be called the Oregon National Forest. This forest is located in Multnomah, Clackamas, Wasco, Marion, Linn, and Crook counties and will continue under the administration of Supervisor Thos. H. Sherrard with headquarters at Portland, Oregon.

Cascade will continue to be the name of that portion of the old "Cascade" Forest (not included in the Fremont) lying between the Willamette valley and Cascade mountain Wagon Road and the middle fork of the Willamette river and West Deschutes river. This forest has an area of 1,845,120 acres and is located in Lane, Linn, Crook and Klamath counties. It will be administered by Supervisor C. R. Seltz with headquarters at Eugene, Oregon.

The forest now to be known as the Umpqua will embrace 1,698,560 acres and will consist of that part of the "Cascade (S)" National Forest (which has not been included in the Fremont) between the middle fork of the Willamette river and the west Deschutes river and the Rogue river and the South Umpqua river divide, also the southern portion of the old "Umpqua" Forest. It is located in Lane, Klamath, Jackson, Coos and Douglas counties. This forest will continue to be administered by Supervisor S. C. Bartrum with headquarters at Roseburg, Oregon.

The Oregon National Forest will contain 1,196,892 acres and will consist of the southern portion of the old "Cascade (S)," the "Ashland" and a portion of the "Klamath" and "Slaklyou" Forests. It is located in Jackson, Klamath, and Curry counties, Oregon, and Shasta county, California. Acting Supervisor C. A. Buck will administer this forest with headquarters at Medford, Oregon.

All of the old "Tillamook" and "Umpqua" Forests, except the southern portion of the old "Umpqua," embracing 974,918 acres, will be known as the Siuslaw National Forest. This forest is located in Tillamook, Lane, Douglas, Coos, Lincoln, Polk and Yamhill counties; Supervisor A. E. Cohoon will administer this forest with headquarters at Eugene, Oregon.

The Forest Service desires to reduce the area of the average administrative units to approximately 1,000,000 acres. This was not possible in all cases as is shown by the fact that under the plan of redistributing there will be 144 Supervisors in the United States who will administer more than 167,000,000 acres of National Forests.

## HARRIMAN RAILROADS TO RESUME WORK SOON.

Omaha, June 30.—Official announcement was made today, that extension work on the Harriman lines will begin July 1, where it stopped several months ago because of financial unrest which threatened the country. Work will begin on the Athol Hill cutoff in Colorado, and extension of the branch line up the North Platte River from North Platte to Northport. Large gangs of men have been sent to both places and will begin work at once. Work on the Athol-Barte cutoff was 80 per cent completed when work was stopped, but the North Platte extension was only fairly started. Work on both will be completed within a few months.
