COURT OF APPEALS STANDS BY RUEF.

San Francisco, June 30.—The District Court of Appeals this afternoon referred to Superior Judge James M. Sewell, the matter of passing upon the sureties on bonds offered by Abe Ruef in his effort to secure his release in bail of \$750,000. By the decision in the habeas corpus proceedings the court took the matter of bail out of the hands of Judge Dunne, before whom it was pending. The court questions the ruling of Judge Dunne in refusing to accept the sureties who could not qualify with San Francisco real estate and also the decision that relatives of Ruef, particularly his father and sister, could not qualify. It is ordered that the matter be referred to Judge Sewell to hear testimony as to the qualifications of sureties; to approve the bonds, if sufficient sureties are produced; and that upon sufficient sureties being approved in the amounts fixed, Ruef be discharged from custody.

RAILWAY MEN ARE IDLE NO MORE

Chicago, June 30.—Thousands of men who will return to work tomorrow after months of enforced idleness are celebrating the happy occasion today. Happy families are to be seen in all the parks and hundreds of little parties went on excursions. Practically every railroad man in the United States will be at work tomorrow, which has been termed "reemployment day" by the enthusiasts who are organizing a branch of the National Prosperity League, similar to the one formed at St. Louis. The Illinois Central, which will be among the largest corporations to reemploy men tomorrow, will put 5,500 railroaders into their old positions after eight months of idleness.

LADD ESTATE IS FINALLY CLOSED UP.

The estate of W. S. Ladd was closed yesterday morning, when Judge Webster in the County Court signed an order approving the final account, which was filed by the executors and executrix. The executors estimate the value of the estate at more than \$5,670,979.77, but how much more they do not say. It has been in the hands of Caroline A. Ladd, the widow, William M. Ladd, Charles E. Ladd and John Wesley Ladd, executrix and executors, since the elder Ladd died, January 6, 1893. It was appraised the same year by Henry Felling, John Catlin and James Mel. Wood at \$7,500,858.95. Of this amount \$4,127,250 was the value placed on the real estate and \$3,373,605.95 the amount at which the personal property was inventoried. Ladd addition, consisting of 32 blocks, was at that time valued at \$1,000,000; Crystal Springs farm, 411 acres, at \$175,000; Canyon City farm, 290 acres at \$145,000; and the Ladd & Tilton Banking business at \$1,250,000. Of the personal property a large part is in stocks and bonds.—Oregonian.

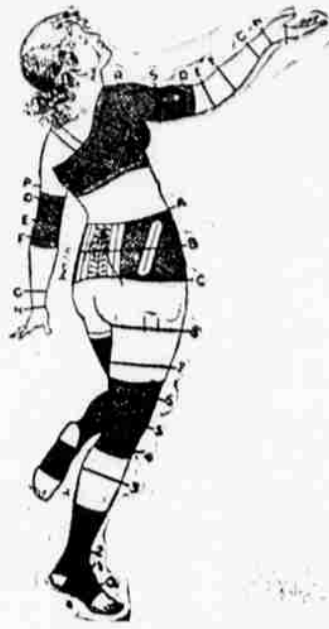
