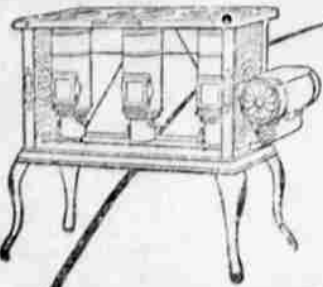

### WORK BEGINS ON OAK STREET PAVING

The Warren Construction Co. this morning put a large force of men to work excavating for the pavement on Oak street. Work was begun immediately north of East Ninth street and the block between there and East Eighth street will be completed as soon as possible, so that the Odd Fellows can proceed with the erection of their five-story brick building without interruption. After the two blocks of Oak street, between East Seventh and East Ninth are completed, Olive street and the other short stretches under the new contract will be paved in their turn.

### SOUTHERN PACIFIC READY TO FIGHT INDICTMENTS.

San Francisco, July 1.—The Southern Pacific company's attorneys are busy today, preparing to fight two more indictments returned against the Harriman line by the Federal grand jury, before it was discharged for the year by United States Circuit Judge De Haven.

The two additional indictments charge the company with having granted rebates to Miller & Lux on shipments of wool from California points to Boston via Stockton, Cal. The officials of the shipping concern were not indicted because of the freedom with which they testified before the grand jury.

The wool was relayed at Stockton and it was contended by the Southern Pacific that the rebate was granted on the first part of the shipment which was wholly within the state. Eight other firms that made shipments of wool on the same days mentioned in the indictment were required to pay a higher rate than Miller & Lux.

### JAPS STOP BUILDING ON BATTLESHIPS.

Tokio, July 1.—Two battleships and two cruisers under construction in Japanese navy yards will not be completed immediately, because of the postponement of the navy department program, according to a report here today. Repairs of the ships captured from the Russians will be rushed, however, so they will be in condition to participate in the naval maneuvers to be conducted this fall.

### MRS. COLTON EMBARRASSED BY BANK WRECKERS.

Washington, July 1.—Financially embarrassed by the embezzlement of \$235,000 by W. J. Barnett and J. Dalzell Brown, trustees of the estate of Mrs. Ella Colton, are going to sell her palatial residence 1617 Connecticut avenue, Washington. Although the estate is worth millions of dollars the loss of the securities reduced the ready cash to such a point that thousands of dollars in debts and taxes remain unpaid.

Convicted at San Francisco of J. Dalzell Brown and W. J. Barnett of embezzlement in the Colton securities made it impossible for the estate to secure judgment against the defunct California Safe Deposit & Trust company, the matter having been made personal. The conviction of its officers as individuals freed the bank from liability.

Conrad P. Syme and R. G. Donaldson have been appointed trustees of the Colton estate and instructed by the court to sell the mansion. The trustees are authorized to raise a levy of \$50,000, pending the sale of the property.
