HARDWARE STORE IN MARSHFIELD MAN'S STOMACH

Dr. Ira B. Bartle, formerly of Eugene, now located at Marshfield, operated upon a man there a few days ago for the removal of a large assortment of junk from his stomach. The Portland Journal tells of it as follows:

Dr. Ira B. Bartle of North Bend was to have opened the scientific program of the Oregon State Medical association yesterday by reading a paper on "Surgical Interference in Some Obstinate Stomach Trouble." Dr. Bartle wired that he couldn't come and sent a telegram saying why. Everybody supposed it was a joke. But it was the truth. Here is the telegram:

"Operated on glass eater this morning. Removed from stomach 3 knives, 5 loaded rifle cartridges, 4 door keys, 17 horse-shoe nails, 4 six-penny nails, 5 dimes, 3 nickels, 1 fish hook, 4 ounces of glass. Obstinate stomach trouble."

FRANK GOTCH HOLDS WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP.

Seattle, July 1.—Frank Gotch, of Humbolt, Ia., maintained his right to the world's catch-as-catch-can wrestling championship tonight when he out-classed Dr. B. F. Roller of Seattle, winning two consecutive falls in 15 minutes and 25 seconds, and 25 minutes and 54 seconds respectively.

The men entered the ring, weighing close to 200 pounds each. Roller may have been a pound or two heavier.

They went at it like bulls from the start and Gotch was soon forcing matters. He worked his notorious toe hold six times in succession in the first bout. Roller broke away each time, but it wore on him and finally Gotch downed him with a crotch and half-Nelson.

Roller did better work in the second bout, but Gotch was like a terrier after a rat, and went from hold to hold with startling rapidity. Roller's best work in this round was to break a half Nelson and a crotch, after being seemingly lost. He was finally picked up and dumped to his shoulders from the same hold. It is doubtful if he really was downed, but it was only a question of minutes anyway, as he was at Gotch's mercy.

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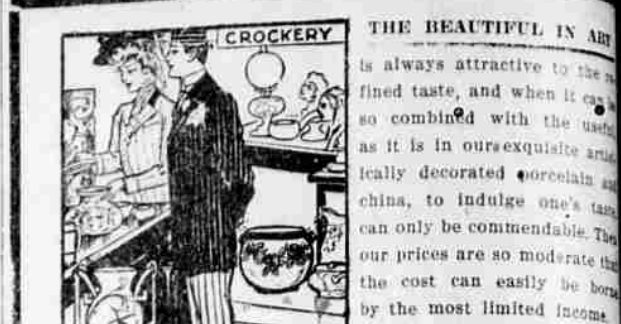
