COLORADO MAN PRAISES CITY OF EUGENE

C. C. Emigh, of Fort Collins, Colo., who recently spent some time touring the west, and visited the family of Free Thomas in this city, writes a long and interesting descriptive letter to the Courier, of his town. We take the following extract from it:

"When through at Portland the writer took a daylight trip up the Willamette valley, which is fertile and very beautiful, abundance of moisture (often too much). Were impressed with the fertile fields, flocks and herds, and fruit."

The temperature is very even, seldom frosts, and about all they need is more railroads and more Colorado push. The altitude at Portland is 54 feet; at Eugene it is 459 feet, and here is the best valley in town and surroundings found on this trip.

Petite, rich soil, rainfall of 35 inches, average temperature of about 50 degrees. They raise all kinds of fruits and berries, almonds and English walnuts, and the Blueberries on this trip, which included California. They pick ripe berries every month in the year. Have a town about as large as Collins, same amount of street cars, put in at the same date, but they can skin Collins on street improvements, as they now have about eight miles of asphalted streets, a new process, which gives a spongy surface, easy on horses, and durable, and they are putting in more. They are an up-to-date town, with fine churches and schools, and the Oregon State University, with 500 students.

Being surrounded on all sides by mountain ranges covered with forests, they have an abundance of lumber, gold and silver mines within 50 miles, and all indications of coal unburied that is in the ground, and we were informed that a 6-foot vein has been opened about 20 miles south in similar formation. They get no rain from June to October, so we think it a coming point for the sugar beet industry, and they are growing samples this season.

All in all this spot captured us, and when we retire from active life, will consider that place favorably. Plenty of business there, many coming in, and we say (more in sorrow than in anger) that it is the new blood that is doing things. Sam Rugh has 8 acres and a fine home a mile out, and all he has to do to pick up a small fortune is to "sit steady" for about five years. Sam is in the real estate business, doing well, happy, seeming to appreciate his opportunities. We also met Carrie Thomas (Niece Carrie Emigh) and family and they think they have found the "Promised Land." I guess they have.

From Eugene, the "Shaasta Route," was a feast of scenery, and in the Rogue River country we found a duplicate of the Hood River fruit and although the altitude is about ten times that of Hood River, they seldom lose crops by frost, and they plant, prune and cultivate their orchards in much the same manner, being especially careful to thin out the fruit on the trees, leaving only a limited number of the best, assuring a salable apple."

ROSEBURG'S MARKET DAY WAS SUCCESS

Roseburg's first "Market Day" held today under the direction of Max Zimmerman drew a large crowd of visitors from all points radiating from the city, says the Review. Merchants who subscribed to the fund to defray the expenses of the event did more than enough business on their special sales to justify the experiment, and it is a safe assertion that "Market Day" will become a regular thing in Roseburg from now on.

The feature of the day was the parade, made up of the Roseburg band and a long string of fine horses, some driven and others led. It began at the Roseburg hotel and ended finally at the Rochdale store, after doubling back to the Hotel McClallen. After the parade broke up the band played in front of the "booster" business houses, preceded in each instance by a "spiel" from the incomparable Zimmerman, whose style of oratory, while short on polish, is several miles long in effectiveness. The auction sale of horses, held at Dixon's stable yards, was the concluding event of the day. It was attended by practically every visitor in the city, and when it was over every one departed satisfied. Now that such an affair has passed the experimental stage, the future holds in store many "bigger and better" ones. All that remains to be done is to set the date.

WHERE FOURTH COMMITTEE OVERLOOKED A BET

The Eugene Fourth of July committee did good work in arranging for the entertainment of their guests at the big celebration but for some cause or other failed to provide for the people of Springfield and the upper Willamette valley to get to that city. Arrangements should have been made to run a train from Wendling to Eugene in the morning and back in the evening. By so doing several hundred people would have attended that otherwise stayed at home. This was where a good bet was overlooked. —Springfield News.

BIG EVENTS SCHEDULED FOR PRESENT WEEK

Washington, D. C., July 13.—There promises to be no dearth of big events this week, either in the home or foreign fields. The Olympic games abroad will attract keen attention on this side of the water, while at home there will be a multitude of big conventions and other events to interest public attention.

King Edward will formally open the great Olympic stadium in Shepherd's Bush Monday. The games will begin next day, and from then until July 25 the greatest aggregation of athletes the world has ever seen will struggle for the mastery. During the week officers and men of the American battleship fleet will be entertained on a magnificent scale at Honolulu.

Commissioners representing the United States and France will meet in Paris to discuss the proposed new commercial arrangement between the two countries.

Canada will be interested in the completion of the preparations for the Quebec Centenary celebration and the departure from England of the notables who are coming to take part in the program of festivities.

The week promises to be one of comparative inactivity for the presidential candidates of the two leading parties, though conferences will be numerous and the plans for the real work of the campaign will be put in shape.

At Columbus, Ohio, the Prohibitionists will meet in national convention Wednesday to adopt a platform and name candidates for president and vice-president. A number of names have been suggested for the head of the ticket and the ultimate selection is problematical.

Two big reunions, one North and one South, will attract attention during the week. In St. Paul the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine will hold forth, while at Dallas thousands of members of the order of E. K. K. will gather for their annual national convention.

Another gathering of interest, though of smaller proportions, will be the annual session of the Jewish Chautauqua at Buffalo.
